Pentecost

Behaviour transformation makes news. Television shows on the transformation of unruly and ill-disciplined young people are watched with interest. Medical advances using drugs or electronic implants show us people's behaviour changing as a result of these therapies. Scandals rock the sporting world as coaches and players are found to be used performance enhancing drugs to gain an edge over their competitors.

Pentecost is the most famous event of behaviour transformation in the history of the Church. The transformation of the followers of Jesus, the twelve apostles and

the other disciples, is the centre of the account. Prior to the transformation these people have locked themselves away in a room for fear of being given the same treatment they saw Jesus receive – arrest, torture, execution. No one could blame them for being frightened. They were frightening times.

The transformation sees them finding courage to leave the locked room and go into the streets to announce that Jesus is risen from the dead. In their proclamation they do not shy away from laying the blame for the death with the leaders of their people.


What changed these people? It was not Dutch courage born of being drunk as some of the bystanders who heard them suggested. As the disciples indicated it was only 9 in the morning and the hotels were not open! St Luke describes the agent of transformation as something that looked like tongues of fire that came and rested on each of them and they were filled with the Holy Spirit.

All those who receive the Spirit and cooperate with it change. They find the courage to witness to their faith. They leave locked rooms and enter the market place confident in their faith – I have something the world needs to hear. They gather with others who have the same faith and thank God for the gift of the Spirit that brings them the fullness of grace and enables them to complete Christ's work on earth.

Our parish website has gone live and so must we.
