GOD IS NEAR US, NOT WATCHING FROM A DISTANCE

During the week some of us in the parish, priests, office staff and pastoral councillors, participated in seminars on sexual abuse. The presenter was Dr Monica Applewhite, an expert in abuse prevention strategies. She has worked for 22 years in this field doing both research and work with offenders and victims. She stressed the need for implementing prevention strategies stating that taking action once an allegation is made means that abuse has already occurred.

The presentation was expertly done and invaluable to those of us in child-service. While we do not know the intentions of people their behaviours are observable and these can be mandated as objectionable and to be avoided.

Dr Applewhite said: "Sometimes people wonder when all this will be over." She said there is no end -- as long as organizations are engaged in serving children and youth, "we have no choice but to address sexual abuse and its prevention."

This material will be part of our parish outlook from now on so that the parish is a place where all our children are safe.

In its own way what Dr Applewhite was saying was a specific instance of how we respond to the voice of God which Moses said was in our mouths and in our hearts. We are capable as Jesus said in his story of the man who was mugged on the journey down the mountain from Jerusalem to Jericho, of acting decisively in the face of harm done to others or ignoring it.

The first two to see him battered and bleeding on the roadside, the priest and the Levite (a temple worker) excused themselves from giving assistance and left him. The Samaritan, despised by the Jews of Jesus day as renegades from the true faith, stopped, gave first aid, took the victim to an inn and left enough money for him to be cared for with a promise to make good any extra on his return.

The gospel stories Jesus told have a way of spot-lighting us and our behaviours as individuals, community and Church. As we continue to respond to sexual abuse we see the Church in all the players in the story of the mugged man. Church people, priests and others, have deliberately harmed others, the muggers. They have seen the wounded people and done nothing constructive to help them. They have been the Samaritan who stopped and helped. The issues are complex but there are clear ways to respond in our care for those abused and, as I

said, to do al we can to ensure abuse is prevented in the future
