Readings - 8 September - 23nd Sunday in Ordinary Time
1st Reading: Wisdom 9:13-18; 2nd Reading Philemon 9-10. 12-17
Gospel: Luke 14:25-33



Growing up I learned off by heart the answer to the question: why did God make me? This was in primary school and we had a little catechism (a collection of the teachings of the church set out in question and answer form) about which we were regularly quizzed by our teachers. Back to the question: why did God make me? The answer is: God made me to know Him, love Him and serve Him here on earth and to be happy with him forever in heaven.

The readings today in part raise the question of our knowing God. Unaided how much can we know? In actual fact especially if we consult some of the finest minds in the Church down through the centuries we can know quite a lot. St Anselm in the 11<sup>th</sup> century spoke of God as that than which nothing greater could be thought. St Thomas Aquinas in the 13<sup>th</sup> century deduced that God was the uncaused cause of everything. His line of thinking was that if we keep going back asking where things came from knowing that all things come from somewhere you reach a point where you are left asking well where did the first thing come from? Our knowledge as it were reaches a point where the only logical place to go is to some cause that just is.

All these "proofs" of the existence of God however just make us realize that we cannot comprehend God fully. If we decided that we had, then we have to say that what we have come to is not God. We are aware of the limitations of our thinking about every day matters so it really comes as no surprise that we come to something of a dead end with our reasoning about God.

Knowledge of God however is important for our full flowering as human beings so the Word of God, God's thinking, takes flesh in Jesus and speaks to us in words we can understand. Jesus speaks to us about how to come alive to God and so to ourselves and the people who are part of our world.

The trouble is as we see in today's gospel that what we have to do is challenging to say the least. What we hear fall from the lips of Jesus are some of the most extreme sayings in the scriptures. We are to give preference to God over family allegiances (the language of the people of Jesus time did not have a word for "prefer" and used the word "hate"). We are to break the hold that our possessions have over us. Those possessions may be important but only to the extent we can use them to serve God by doing good at all times. Our family relationships are important but likewise they are to help us do God's will not hinder that activity. Today is a God-given time to weigh up where we are with our thinking about God and our mission in life.

This feature length animated film with a terrific line up of mostly British actors (including Ian Holm, Alfred Molina, Julie Christie, William Hurt,) provides the voices for this clay- and cel-animation rendering of the greatest story ever told. 


