What is in a name?

Marketing has made us well aware of the no name approach. No name brand grocery products, clear skin bottles of wine, generic medicines in the pharmacies are offered at a lower price to those with registered brand names. Even though the products may have exactly the same ingredients often for our own reasons we choose the one with a name, usually one that we recognise. Often, so I am told, the products come from the same manufacturer and the manufacturer as a result does not miss out on selling what they produce regardless of how it is labelled. What might make for clever marketing strategies does not capture how God relates with all of us who are made in the divine image. Names are important. Our name is part of our individuality. We are pleased when people remember our name. We are not just a faceless no name part of the crowd. Companies these days know this and use it as a marketing strategy. They insist on those who call being addressed by their name which at times can irritate because it assumes a degree of intimacy that may not exist and which the caller may not wish to exist at that time. I confess that

I act perversely some times by responding that my name is Father Farrelly or Doctor Farrelly rather than divulge my Christian name. But enough of that.

The story that Jesus tells today about the consequence of indifference to the physical wellbeing of those around us interestingly though indirectly focuses on names and no names. This story is the only one of all those told by Jesus where one of the characters has a name. The character is called Lazarus and he is a pitiful situation. He lives on the street begging. He is sick and tended to only by dogs that lick him. The no name rich man absorbed in his well-to-do life style is not even aware that Lazarus exists or if he does, does not see he has to do anything about him. With the mindset of the day if he did see him he would have seen the plight he was in as the result of his own sin or the sin of his parents!

The story continues. Both men die. In the next life the roles are reversed. Lazarus enjoys the company of Abraham the father in faith of the people while the rich man is in torment and longing just for a drop of water. The story does not say that there was anything virtuous about Lazarus for him to find happiness. Nor does it say that the rich man did evil. All we know is that he was not aware of Lazarus or if he was, he acted with complete indifference to him. In all likelihood if he did know of his existence, he did not know his name. Lazarus was not a person for him. He was a nobody.

Today is Social Justice Sunday and the Bishops of Australia have issued their annual statement. This year the title is "Lazarus at our gate." Nationally, locally and personally the bishops pose the question about those in need whom we can so easily not see or treat as nobodies.

Jesus told stories for people to see themselves and see where they needed to change. In this story the stakes are high. In this life we can change. In the next that possibility is gone. Even if they wanted to, Lazarus cannot go to the no name any more than he can come to Lazarus. The closed heart and mind of no name has created a gulf that cannot be bridged. When he was with his friends did he speak of people by labels not names. Did he refer to parasites, bleeding hearts, do gooders? Are we label users or name users? Whom do we not notice? Now is the time to change.






ST AGATHA'S JUNIOR CHOIR Do you love to sing??

This session will focus on (1) music for Lent including psalms (seasonal and otherwise), Gospel





NET Ministries is a Catholic peer-to-peer youth ministry whose volunteers proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ to the young people of Australia.


- NET team members are 18 to 30 years old
