## Readings - 6 October - 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

**1st Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4; 2nd Reading 2 Timothy 1:6-8. 13-14**

**Gospel: Luke 17:5-10**



### INCREASE OUR FAITH

Listen carefully to the opening words of today's Gospel reading. In response to the request from the apostles that Jesus do something to increase their faith, Jesus speaks of faith having almost a paranormal quality; as if by faith we can affect even the natural world around us. He uses the example of up rooting a mulberry tree and planting it in the sea. Is Jesus talking about telekinesis, the ability to move things by the power of your mind alone? Probably not. We can talk about the power of the mind another time. What Jesus is saying is that our faith can have impact, real impact in the world around us. People with a living faith change the worlds in which they live! People with the living faith in Jesus changed their worlds for the better.

For us as Christ's faithful, as members of his body here on earth, faith is a reality that encompasses how we look at our world and interact with it and also what we can call the objective content of our faith. The latter part, the objective content, we put into words each time we recite the creed. We acknowledge God the Father creating the world in a nonviolent act of love. We acknowledge the historical reality of the incarnation of the Son of God in the person of Jesus whose mother was Mary and the judge who issued the death penalty was Pontius Pilate. We acknowledge the third person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit, was sent from the Father and the Son to complete Christ's work on earth. We acknowledge the reality of the church as the institution established by Jesus to complete that work. We acknowledge the communion of saints, those who respond to the Holy Spirit here in this life and those who now see God face to face in heaven. We acknowledge the forgiveness of sins, that God constantly wants us to undergo a deep change of heart and turn from doing evil to doing good. We acknowledge the resurrection from the dead, that what happened to Jesus is what is in store for us. We acknowledge everlasting life, and even though we had a beginning we will never cease to exist.

And as we think about each of these realities that we acknowledge as part of our belief in our recitation of the creed, we can see that each of them shapes the way we look at reality. Our world is not something that exists by chance. It flowers as a result of a nonviolent act of love. God walked among us as a person who had a mother and a condemning judge. We come alive having breathed in the spirit given to complete Christ's work on earth and bring us to the fullness of grace. Faith in this sense is a mindset we put on. We choose to look at the world in a particular way. This is no leap into the dark. Our eyes are firmly fixed on Jesus himself. We want to do and we can do what he did.

How can our faith increase? Simply by choosing to do each day all that Jesus did. As with every other human activity the more we put that activity into practice the more it becomes a deep seated part of us.

NET Ministries is a Catholic peer-to-peer youth ministry whose volunteers proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ to the young people of Australia.


- NET team members are 18 to 30 years old
