FAMILY TREES: FROM WHOM DO I COME?

Family trees fascinate those caught by the bug of researching their ancestors. The deeper they dig, the more facts appear and a from time to time a skeleton or two. Family trees are about individuals and relationships. Without relationships (publicly acknowledged ones and "skeleton" ones alike) there is no generation of new life and it is the relationships enjoyed by our ancestors that are most interesting.

The part of the gospel of St Matthew that we listen to on this fourth and last Sunday of Advent (only three sleeps to Christmas) is the end of the family tree compiled by Matthew. Writing as he was for Christians who came from a Jewish

background he begins his family tree with Abraham, the father of the faith, and ends with Joseph. St Luke, for your information, writing for Christians from a predominantly Gentile background, takes the ancestors of Jesus back to Adam, the father of the human race.

Matthew meets head on the problem the newly betrothed couple faced with Mary's unexpected pregnancy. In all likelihood as best we can understand from research into the marriage customs of the time Joseph and Mary had celebrated the wedding ceremony but were not yet living together. Joseph had options on what to do. He could take Mary to court and if adultery was proven he could keep the dowry. If the pregnancy was the result of assault the dowry was returned. On the other hand he could quietly divorce her outside a court hearing. This is what he was planning to do to protect Mary's reputation as best he could.

As with most genealogists Matthew does not know all the conversations Mary and Joseph had about the pregnancy. What he did record was that the angel of the Lord explained the situation to Joseph. He asked Joseph to take Mary into his home as his wife. He was to name the baby boy and give him the name Jesus. He told him the child was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit not by any normal human love-making.

By naming Jesus and taking him as his son Jesus became part of the line of King David from whom the prophet had foretold seven centuries before that the Messiah would come. Jesus would be son of David and son of God. His ancestors, like all of ours, were a mixed group of saints and sinners, upright and rogues. This immersion in the human situation was the way we who make an act of faith in Jesus and embrace his life in the power of the same Holy Spirit that brought about his conception, this is the way we find the freedom we so desire.

For those who shall be away from the parish for the celebration of the birth of the Lord, may you welcome from God the blessings of each day, of peace, love and self-control and so enable the world you are part of know the freedom and joy God wants all to enjoy.
