#### JOHN THE BAPTIST AND CHRISTMAS

Only once in my life have I received a Christmas card with John the Baptist featured in it. And that card was a homemade effort by a parishioner of St Agatha's after I had proclaimed on one Sunday in Advent that I had never received such a card

The reason for his absence is not too hard to fathom. Historically at the time Jesus was born, John was himself only a 6 month old infant being lovingly cared for by his mother and father, Elizabeth and Zechariah. They did not live in Bethlehem so escaped the paranoia fuelled massacre of baby boys ordered by Herod when he heard that a potential rival had been born. So the first reason is that there would be no place for John in the Christmas stories. These stories by the way are the "food blender" output of crunching the accounts of Matthew and Luke together effectively destroying the distinctiveness of each. More about that another time.

The other reason John does not feature in popular Christmas cards and decorations is that he is not politically correct. He does not fit the sentimental image of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, animals, shepherds, wise men and angels. John features in the Advent liturgies but his words are unsettling. While we look at Christmas lights, here is this strange character asking us if light and goodness are shining from us. As we stock the fridge and cupboards for Christmas eating, he asks did we donate the same amount to St Vinnies (I have seen tins left at the giving tree because they were past their use by date!). As we buy gifts for people with more than they need, he asks do we give time and attention to family and loved ones or are we too busy with business, socialising, gaming or recreation.


His questions faced up to and answered selflessly will make us great gifts to be received by others. Let's do it!
