WHAT TO LEARN FROM THE HOLY FAMILY OF MARY JOSEPH AND JESUS

One of my friends, a mother of eight, celebrated reconciliation and was given as a penance that she spend time asking Mary for assistance with the difficulties she was meeting in life within her family. She remembers the look on the priest's face when she said: what help could she be? She only had one and he was divine!

My friend's question was a good one. What help could Mary and Joseph and Jesus be? What did they have to tell her about life with her husband and the eight children?

Joseph and Mary would be reassuring her of the importance of talking as a couple, listening to each other to see what response to make. We do not know how far advanced in the pregnancy Mary was when Joseph seriously considered quietly divorcing his beloved so that her reputation was not damaged by his taking her to court. Even if only they were aware of it and no one else they would have talked. Both lived as believing people so were open to discerning God's will in all of this. It was here that Joseph found the

courage to take his beloved Mary home as his wife and take as his own the child she was carrying. Together they would handle those who would count the number of months from the time Joseph took Mary into his home and the birth of Jesus!

Together they would contend with a make-shift delivery room when Mary gave birth away from home and the support of family and friends. They would discuss long and earnestly what lay in store for this child as group after group, shepherds and gentiles from the East, would be drawn to him as someone of great importance. They would puzzle over the things said of him when he was circumcised. They would flee their homeland to seek asylum in a foreign country to avoid their son being killed in the paranoia inspired massacre called for by Herod.

Settled in Nazareth in the north of the country they would live day to day family life earning a living, sharing the load of daily life and attending synagogue on the Sabbath. They were not alone in this village as other relatives lived there too. Mary and Joseph would be beside themselves when they lost their 12 or 13 year old when they went to Jerusalem possibly to celebrate Jesus' bar mitzvah, his passage to adulthood in the faith.

Later in life as he left carpentering behind and joined forces with his cousin John in specifically religious activities, they or at least his mother would be seriously concerned for his mental health and he entered open conflict with the religious authorities.

My friend with her eight came to realize that the life Mary, Joseph and Jesus lived was not that different from her own. In fact while she and her husband had the challenge of caring for the well-being of eight very different people who were flesh of their own flesh there were experiences she hoped never to face like seeing one of her own arrested, tortured and executed before her very eyes. She may have to face the tragedy of burying a child but not in those circumstances.

She offered her reflections to anyone who may have ever been tempted to ask as she had asked: what could Mary do to assist her? What could Joseph do? What could the life of their family show her? She humbly admitted to herself: a lot!
