

> Readings - Second Sunday in Ordinary Time - 19 January 2014 1st Reading: Isaiah 49:3, 5-6; 2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:1-3; Gospel: John 1:29-34



The ritual responses we make at mass were not chosen just to give us something to say. Many of them are lifted from different parts of the New Testament, the letters of St Paul or the gospels. In much the same way that our church buildings are teaching aids (take a tour through a church building and check the furnishings, the decorations, the statues, pictures and see what you learn about your faith) so too the words used in the liturgy deepen our knowledge of different parts of the scriptures and the characters encountered. This Sunday words used by St Paul in his letter to the Corinthians "May God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ send you grace and peace" have become one of the greetings used at the beginning of mass: "Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." Next time you hear it, recall Paul writing a letter to the Corinthians.

Another phrase that comes straight from John the Baptist as recorded by St John in his gospel is "Lamb of God". At mass we hear and use it a number of times, principally as we prepare to receive our Lord in Holy Communion.

As the priest breaks the consecrated host we say or sing twice: "Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us" and then a third time we end by asking that the Lamb will give us peace.

A lamb is synonymous with helplessness that calls for protection. For the Jewish people as well it was the food eaten to recall annually their deliverance from slavery in Egypt at the celebration of the Passover.

Isaiah, the prophet, speaks often a servant of God who will suffer for the sake of the people, who like a lamb will go dumb before the one who will slaughter it.

The early church saw in the description of Isaiah's servant the person of Jesus himself who as he died on the cross did not scream about the unfairness of what was being done, but was silent apart from praying for his executioners, encouraging one who died with him and consoling his disciples entrusting his mother Mary to their care.

This non-violent surrender of his life opened the way for people to break the hold that sin always seeks to have on us. Jesus is the Lamb of God. We who are called to the supper he sets before us are called blessed: Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb. As we open the doors of our souls, Our Lord accepts our invitation to come inside and powerfully and gently changes our intellect and will, how we think and how we choose. Sin's hold over us is broken.

As we approach Holy Communion, the supper the Lamb himself presides at and in which he gives us himself, reflect deeply on how you are blessed to be doing this simple act. Return to your seat and thank the Lord for the gift of himself. As you leave the Church at the conclusion of mass (resist the temptation to leave immediately after receiving Holy Communion) commit yourself to take Our Lord to everyone you meet.


