CHANCE MEETINGS - MOMENTS OF GRACE, MOMENTS OF STRUGGLE

Cast your mind back to yesterday. Recall the people you met and the words you exchanged. In a family setting there was your wife or husband, your children. What was said? A simple greeting, reminders for the day ahead and readying for those activities. Out of the house there were people at the bus stop and on the bus. The young man or woman when you bought a coffee. Colleagues at work, other mothers at day care or outside school hours care. Work meetings and lunch breaks. Assistants in shops and supermarkets. Fellow parishioners doing their shopping.

Jesus and his friends walk to the Samaritan village of today's gospel. They part company so Jesus can catch his breath while they go into the village to buy something to eat. They decided to eat outside the village to avoid any unpleasantness that often arose when Samaritans and Jews came together.

Jesus sits down near the well in the shade of a tree. He is tired and thirsty. It is midday and the sun is hot. A lone woman comes with her bucket to get water for herself and loved ones. Jesus asks for a drink ignoring the taboos about Jews mixing with Samaritans and a lone man engaging in conversation with a lone woman.

The conversation, as is often the case in chance meetings, covers a broad spectrum of topics from how to quench thirst without a bucket to sites of religious significance and religious differences, to the woman's marital issues (coming to get water alone at midday and not with the women in the morning was a clue Jesus did not miss) and on to Jesus admitting to this stranger that he was the Messiah. This chance meeting was a moment of grace for the much married and partnered woman and the beginning of a new role as a disciple telling others about Jesus. She experienced a deep sense of joy in the exchange.

God is always present and loving us. The occasions of this divine loving are all the meetings we have each day. Take the time to sit at the end of the day and go over each meeting. Bring all the people to mind recalling who said what and most importantly what you felt during the meeting and afterwards. Those that lifted you and brought a smile are the touch of God. Those that left you desolate reveal the devil at work making a mess of God's plan and tempting us to think God does not care. That message is a lie for us to resist and an occasion to reaffirm our faith.
