SEEING CLEARLY BRINGS REAL CHALLENGES

Imagine for a moment that you had no sight and had been that way from birth. You have no experience of light and darkness, of colour, of what flora and fauna look like, of a city skyline, movies and television commercials. You know your family by sound and scent and feel but you have no experience of what they look like. This is the man in today's gospel reading. In your imagination you are that man.

He overhears people talking about him and his blindness. He hears Jesus talking about God's work being revealed in him. Either Jesus or one of the disciples told him the one talking was Jesus. Jesus makes some mud from his own saliva and smears the man's eyes and tells him

to go to a nearby pool and wash his face. Presumably with assistance he goes with his muddied face. Did people wonder the way people do every Ash Wednesday when Catholics walk city streets with a visible mark on their foreheads. Have you ever been surprised how many Catholics you pass and never know it apart from that one Wednesday?

After washing his face he gains sight. Remember this man has never had sight. Was it a friend or family member who helped him get to the pool of water? He looks at him or her and has to put the features with the voice. He sees streets and buildings and clouds and the sun and birds and animals. He sees men and women and boys and girls. How does he handle the flood of data?

He is struggling with all this when he finds himself being questioned and responding with his account. Jesus, by this time, has moved on. He gives the same testimony to the Pharisees who condemn Jesus for working on the Sabbath by making mud. The now seeing former beggar merely repeats his testimony and concludes Jesus is a prophet. The Pharisees are getting more unhappy and attempt to put their spin on the incident to show Jesus is a sinner. The seeing beggar does not buy it and repeats his testimony and says that such a good thing surely could not come from someone off-side with God. The Pharisees tire of him, abuse him and tell him to clear out.

Only then does Jesus return to the scene. First he speaks with the beggar and assures him that he is the Son of Man, his own description of himself as the Messiah. Then Jesus engages the Pharisees and confronts them with their own self-imposed blindness.

As a professing Catholics you see the world as it is. You may look and sound odd at times like the beggar walking the streets with mud on his face. You don't have all the answers life throws up but you know that it is Jesus who has given you a way of seeing the world for the first time. You have to get to know it with a new sense. Previously, like the beggar when blind, your construct of the world was the product of only some of your senses – smell, touch, hearing, taste. Sight brings it all together as it comes from God's creative initiative. Tell others about the one who has given you this amazing vision.
