
By the time St John wrote his gospel the church had been in existence for close on 70 years. In that time it had begun taking the shape that would characterise it down to the present with an overseer (episkopos - from which comes the word "episcopal" hence our word "bishop"), presbyters/priests, deacons caring as shepherds for a community of men and women who believed in Christ, shared in the Eucharist, shared with one another and those outside their community in the way Jesus did. With 70 years having passed, they were accepting that the second coming of Jesus was not going to happen any time soon. They realised that they were part of His grander plan for the whole world and not just the small neighbourhood around the shores of the Mediterranean where they lived.

We have no idea how long this time of the Church will last. 2000 years maybe a drop in the ocean if the race continues for hundreds of thousands of years. Where will our race be in the 121<sup>st</sup> century or beyond? What will the Church be doing then? Pointing to one side technological advances or regressions that may have occurred in that time, the Church of the far distant future will still look to Christ as the end point of human development. As the Greek letters that decorate the front of the altar in St Agatha's proclaim Jesus is the alpha A and the omega  $\Omega$ , the beginning and the end.

We deal now with the technology that we have that Jesus commandment to seek the well-being of others at all times, to act always in a way that respects the dignity each has because they have been willed into existence by a non-violent act of the divine will, in other words to love them, will always be the benchmark we judge our actions by. Those who feel crushed because their postings did not score as many likes as someone else's, those whose good name is trashed by malicious tweets are the people we are called to reveal the love of Christ to. I suggested as a Lenten discipline that we refrain from answering a phone call or responding to a text message while talking with someone else because in that seemingly simple act we are actively devaluing the person we are with.

The Church of the distant future will still take to heart the words Jesus spoke to Thomas who had the courage to ask the way to where Jesus was going. Jesus said "I am the way, the truth and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me." Jesus is the door, the portal, through which we come into the presence of the Father who holds us in existence. Jesus is the truth about how to exist and act as a human being at all times and places. In embracing Jesus as the be all and end all existence, we come alive in a way that nothing else comes close to.

We do look to Jesus taking us to a dwelling in his Father's house when this way of existing comes to a close with the experience we call death, but we need always be aware that even now He takes us to the Father's house. The early Church could no longer see Jesus in the flesh but it was still touched by him, consoled by him, set free from sin and healed by him in and through the action of the Church which he brought into existence to complete his work on earth and bring all to the fullness of grace.
