## SEEING IS MORE THAN HAVING OUR EYES OPEN

I have always enjoyed drawing. Many people do not. The main reason for their dissatisfaction is that the drawing they produce does not look anything like what was there in front of them. One of my instructors drew my attention to why this happens. As we grow up we are taught to know the names of things, how to count, how to express ourselves. We fill our heads with concepts. A mountain is like an upside down triangle. A human being has a head that looks a bit like a circle, a trunk that looks a bit like a rectangle, arms that look a bit like skinny rectangles and feet and hands that sit on the end of the rectangles. A face has two eyes, two ears, one nose and one mouth. So as we draw we are reproducing triangles, rectangles, circles. It is



no wonder that the finished work disappoints us and looks nothing like the mountain in front of us or the man or woman with their own distinctive face.

Those who are skilled at drawing really look at what is there in front of them. They see the angles, the shapes, the actual shape of the eye with its pupil, eyelids, eyebrows. To bring this home to us we did an exercise, we had a picture of a face which we had to copy. However what we had to do was turn the picture upside down before we started. What this did was force us to look at what was there and simply drawing the lines we saw in front of us. When we finished, we turned our drawing up the right way and lo and behold, our reproduction was remarkably like the original. Turning the original upside down effectively shut down our thinking processes and forced us to really see.

What, you may ask, has this to do with living our faith? The answer is 'everything'. People with faith are in the same physical world that everyone else is but they see the world differently. The reason for seeing differently is their choice of seeing the world as Our Lord sees it. Jesus began always with the world as held in existence by the Father. His mind echoed with the refrain in the seven day creation story. God said let there be this or that and this or that came into being and what came into being God saw as good. Everything was good.

Jesus in his life looked at people and loved them. He desired all that was best for them. He saw the blocks they erected in themselves that stunted their growth or sold themselves short. He set people free from these restrictions and they blossomed.

We do not see Jesus in the flesh at this time of our life (that will come later) but he is not absent. He is in us and through him we are in the Father. This reality allows us to see the world around us and instead of whinging about what is wrong, we see the gifts and abilities given us and commit ourselves to bringing about change.

## ST VINCENT DE PAUL CLAYFIELD CONFERENCE REPORT

During the ten months from 1 July 2013 to 30 April 2014 Clayfield members of SVDP visited 408 clients. These clients live in our designated area which extends from Pinkenba to Bowen Hills. Families and individual clients received assistance with food vouchers, electricity, telephone, medical bills, clothing and furniture. We distributed \$24,225.00 to cover these various needs. The conference is always looking for new members. We hold our meetings fortnightly on a Monday in the Presbytery commencing at 5.00pm. The meetings last for about an hour.
