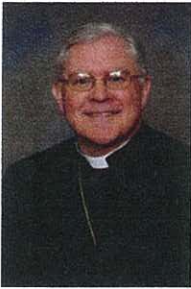

## Institute Presenter

### Archbishop Mark Coleridge

D.D., B.A., D.S.S.  
Brisbane



Melbourne-born, **Mark Benedict Coleridge** intended to enter the diplomatic corps and thus completed an Arts degree at Melbourne University. Circumstances changed however, and he answered God's call to the priesthood instead.

After ordination in 1974, Father Mark worked in various Melbourne parishes, studied Sacred Scripture in Rome and Jerusalem and, upon completing doctoral studies in Rome, was appointed to the Catholic Theological College in Melbourne.

Father Mark then worked in the **Vatican Secretariat of State**, before being ordained **Auxiliary Bishop for Melbourne**. He was also named **Chair of the International Commission for the Preparation of an English-language Lectionary**.

In 2006, Bishop Mark was appointed **Archbishop of the Canberra and Goulburn Archdiocese**, before moving to Brisbane as **Metropolitan Archbishop of Brisbane** in 2012.

Reflecting on his four decades as priest and Bishop, Archbishop Mark has noted that almost nothing had turned out as he expected but, invariably, events had been better than if he had planned them himself.

As he has been moved to reflect: "Jesus often surprises, but He never disappoints."

## Story and Theology in Scripture

'The Bible is revolutionary in its understanding of the relationship between God and the human being. God decides to enter into partnership with the human being. The story will make clear that when the partnership is accepted, things go well for the human being and badly when it's rejected. Scripture will also tell a story of the God who never rejects the partnership that was his idea in the first place. Finally, in Jesus the partnership comes to its fullness.'
