Ist Sunday of Lent "I have now brought you the first fruits of the products of the soil which you, O Lord, have given to me." (Deuteronomy 26:10)

Dear sisters and brothers,

Thank you again to all who were part of last Sunday's Installation Mass. It was important to me that it was a celebration of this community because the true strength of the Church rests with the gifts of all baptised. I look forward to journeying with you through the years ahead to build up the Church and serve God's Kingdom in our part of the world.

Now to more practical matters. Starting this week (Monday), repair work will be carried out of the church roof. Tiles and roofing were damaged during the hail storm in November 2014. This repair work will require scaffolding being placed around the church for two-to-three weeks. As a consequence, external access around the church will be restricted at certain times. This may include the pathway between the church and presbytery which leads up to the school, but this will be only for short periods for safety reasons. This will also mean that the side-door of the church (presbytery side) may not be accessible during those periods. Special arrangements will be in-place during school drop-off and pick-up times, with a supervisor to be on -site to monitor safety. I know that these measures will cause some inconvenience but public and workplace safety are paramount. Please co-operate with all safety measures and directions, as this will ensure that the repairs are expedited smoothly and with minimal disruption. I will keep you updated as the repairs proceed.

This Sunday, at 3pm at the Cathedral, the Rite of Election is celebrated. This is an important step for those preparing to be initiated at the Easter Vigil. Tina Locantro and Indianna Wort will be welcomed as members of the Elect. This means that they, along with a couple of hundred others across the diocese, are moving into their final stage of preparation. Also we acknowledge those who are baptised in other traditions and those who will complete their Catholic initiation at the Easter vigil or during the Easter season. Please continue to pray for James Kelaher, Cate Barrett, Sam Toohey who will be received into the Church and Kelli Paton and Jarred Moss who will complete their Catholic initiation. They are a sign to us of the vitality of the Church and the rich calling of faith. May we be a sign to them of the joy, friendship and consolation which comes from being a follower of Christ.

2016 - The Year of Mercy

A Word of Mercy.... The Church is a mother because she always generates new sons and daughters in faith; the Church is a mother also because she nurtures faith; and the Church is a mother also because she offers God's forgiveness, regenerating new life, the fruit of conversion. (Pope Francis)

This week's *Clayfield Conversations* is an extract from Archbishop Mark Coleridge's Lenten Message for 2016. Full copies are available near the front door of the church.

The Door Wide Open

In recent times we've heard a lot of talk about the need for reform and innovation in Australia – reform of the tax system usually and innovation across the board, turning good ideas into good business. Through Lent we see that each of us needs reform with an element of innovation, and that's what the Sacrament of Mercy is about. But it's not just individuals who need reform and innovation; so too does the Church. This was what Pope John XXII meant when he spoke of *aggiornamento* at the Second Vatican Council. He intended a reform that would enable a new evangelisation. The reform would have one eye firmly fixed on the ways of early Christianity and the other eye no less firmly fixed on the reality of now.

At the heart of the Council's teaching was a vision of the synodality of the Church, which was also central to the recent Synods on marriage and the family. When Pope Francis spoke at the last Synod about the synodality of the Church, he saw it as something applying to all of the Church all of the time, not just some of the bishops some of the time. He went on to say that a synodal Church had to be a listening Church, a people journeying with ears wide open. It has to be a Church listening above all to the voice of the Holy Spirit who speaks in ways that need to be discerned. Part of that discernment is patience, waiting for the Spirit to speak from the silence. Then it requires understanding of what we hear, because the Spirit doesn't always speak in ways we expect or grasp immediately. Finally, it calls for obedience, a willingness to act on what we hear, even if it seems strange or too demanding.

We must also listen anew to each other, aware that the Spirit doesn't always speak through the people we expect. The Spirit doesn't always speak through the leaders, but may speak through the least, those who inhabit not the centre but the periphery. The Spirit may speak through people with a different accent or from a different culture, people who can be hard to understand and who leave us asking what it is they're really saying. The Spirit may speak through people whom we find difficult or with whom we disagree, but to whom we need to listen if we really are journeying together.

The Church must also learn more of what it means to listen to the voice of the world, without ever becoming worldly – indeed to listen to the voice of the world in order *not* to become worldly. The world can certainly learn from the Church, but so too the Church can learn from the world. The prime dialogue is between God and the world, not God and the Church. God has a Church for the sake of the world. That's why the dialogue between the Church and the world – with the mutuality it implies – really does matter. If the Church can't listen to the world, to its deepest groanings, then it's unlikely that we'll be listening to the real God.
