Dear sisters and brothers,

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost. Our children who are preparing to celebrate confirmation will also re-light their baptismal candles this weekend. Confirmation is the sacrament of the fullness of the Holy Spirit, the gift that we first receive in baptism. The light of the baptismal candle is a reminder to them and to us of the gift of the flame of faith that rests upon us through baptism and confirmation. Let us pray for them and their families that this flame of faith may continue to burn brightly within them

Pentecost is the feast day of the birth of a missionary Church. The Holy Spirit flows over the Church today. There is ancient Latin prayer called *Veni sancte spiritus* (Come Holy Spirit) dating from the 13th century. It is the prayer, known as the Sequence, that we say together after the second reading on this feast day. Below is a powerful, contemporary translation of this prayer. It is worth taking some time to ponder this prayer on the Feast of Pentecost:

Send me no more messages or messengers, even if they come from heaven.

You come. Please. I'm begging. Come.

Help me not to feel so poor; shed some light in my heart;

bring what no-one else can give, dearest house-guest of my heart.

You are sweet refreshment, rest from this toil, cool in this heat, relief for this pain.

Help me to believe again. Make some glimmer in this deep.

Shine on wealth where I see naught.

Wash over all this grime; water this dry parched earth;

heal these tired old wounds.

See me taut and bend me; feel me cold and warm me;

find me lost and bring me back.

I can count your seven gifts, make me know then that I need them.

Give me reward, too, for small dear efforts, salvation at the end, joy that lasts.

May the joyful Spirit of Pentecost be with you.

2016 - The Year of Mercy

A Word of Mercy....We are all called to become living writers of the Gospel, heralds of the Good News to all men and women of today. We do this by practicing the corporal and spiritual works of mercy, which are the hallmarks of the Christian life. (*Pope Francis*)

Clayfield Conversations

Over the next couple of weeks, we will take a closer look at Pope Francis' latest document, *Amoris Laetitia* (The Joy of Love). Fr. James Martin SJ of *America* magazine guides us through the top ten points of *Amoris Laetitia*.

Top Ten Takeaways from Amoris Laetitia

Pope Francis's ground-breaking new document *Amoris Laetitia* ("The Joy of Love") asks the Church to meet people where they are, to consider the complexities of people's lives and to respect people's consciences when it comes to moral decisions. The apostolic exhortation is mainly a document that reflects on family life and encourages families. But it is also the pope's reminder that the church should avoid simply judging people and imposing rules on them without considering their struggles.

Using insights from the Synod of Bishops on the Family and from bishops' conferences from around the world, Pope Francis affirms church teaching on family life and marriage, but strongly emphasizes the role of personal conscience and pastoral discernment. He urges the church to appreciate the context of people's lives when helping them make good decisions. The goal is to help families — in fact, everyone — experience God's love and know that they are welcome members of the church. All this may require what the pope calls "new pastoral methods" (199). Here are (the final two of the) ten things to know about the pope's ground-breaking new document (continued from last week):

- 9. *All men and women should be respected*. While same-sex marriage is not permitted, the pope says that he wants to reaffirm "before all else" that the homosexual person needs to be "respected in his or her dignity and treated with consideration, and 'every sign of unjust discrimination' is to be carefully avoided, particularly any form of aggression or violence." Families with LGBT members need "respectful pastoral guidance" from the church and its pastors so that gays and lesbians can fully carry out God's will in their lives (250).
- 10. All are welcome. The church must help families of every sort, and people in every state of life, know that, even in their imperfections, they are loved by God and can help others experience that love. Likewise, pastors must work to make people feel welcome in the church. Amoris Laetitia offers the vision of a pastoral and merciful church that encourages people to experience the "joy of love." The family is an absolutely essential part of the church, because after all, the church is a "family of families" (80).

Following consultation with the parish community, an earlier Saturday evening will be trialled. From <u>Saturday</u>, <u>2nd July</u> the 6pm Saturday Mass will change to 5pm.
