WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

Friday 3 March 2017



Seeing Jesus coming towards him, John said, "Look, there is the lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world."

Dear Friends,

We begin the season known as "Ordinary Time". "Ordinary Time" does not mean ordinary in the usual sense of the term. "Ordinary" refers to "ordinal time", as in "ordinal numbers" or, if you like, "counted time" (e.g.

First, second, third, etc). The liturgical colour is green, which is the colour of growth. It is meant to be the season in which we continue to grow in faith and grow in our humanity. It is the longest feast of the Church's year. "Ordinary Time" is not the name we give to the season when nothing is happening — it is the season in which we live the ordinary moments that make-up our life. Let us embrace this season as an opportunity to continue to deepen our faith and broaden our horizon.

A number of people have asked if there will be a second priest appointed to the parish. At this stage, there will be no permanent appointment. Given that I have a number of outside commitments at the seminary and with Brisbane Catholic Education, we will rely on supply priests to assist with week day and Sunday Masses. Fr. John Sullivan is available to help us with some of the week day Masses (at this stage, Wednesdays and Fridays) and Fr. Orm Rush, who lectures in theology at ACU, will support us on weekends. Fr. Orm will commence towards the end of January. I am grateful to both for their assistance with the parish Masses and I know that you will make them welcome.

Our teachers are back at school this coming week, and I will be joining the staff of St. Agatha's School down at the Gold Coast later in the week for some professional development days. This means that the start of school for our children is not far away (is that a sigh of relief I hear from some of our parents?). The summer holidays come and go, and we will soon be in full swing. May this "ordinary time" be a season of new growth for each of us and our parish community. *Fr. Anthony*

Proclamation of Feasts for 2017

While a day like Christmas is fixed in our minds and on the calendars on December 25th, many of the important feasts of the Church year move, based upon the date that Easter is set. Easter changes each year moving to the Sunday after the "Paschal Full Moon," and can fall between March 22 and April 25.

In ancient times before calendars were common, most people did not know the dates for the upcoming Liturgical year. On Epiphany Sunday (which was last Sunday), the upcoming dates were "proclaimed" after the gospel in this way:

> Dear brothers and sisters, the glory of the Lord has shone upon us, and shall ever be manifest among us, until the day of his return.

Through the rhythms of times and seasons let us celebrate the mysteries of salvation.

Let us recall the year's culmination,

the Easter Triduum of the Lord:

his last supper, his crucifixion, his burial, and his rising celebrated between the evening of the Thirteenth day of April and the evening of the Fifteenth day of April, Easter Sunday being on the Sixteenth day of April.

Each Easter — as on each Sunday —

the Holy Church makes present the great and saving deed by which Christ has for ever conquered sin and death. From Easter are reckoned all the days we keep holy.

Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, will occur on the First day of March. The Ascension of the Lord will be commemorated on Sunday, the Twenty-Eighth day of May. Pentecost, the joyful conclusion of the season of Easter, will be celebrated on the Fourth day of June.

And, this year the First Sunday of Advent will be on the Third day of December, making Advent the shortest it can be.

Likewise the pilgrim Church proclaims the passover of Christ in the feasts of the holy Mother of God, in the feasts of the Apostles and Saints, and in the commemoration of the faithful departed. To Jesus Christ, who was, who is, and who is to come, Lord of time and history, be endless praise, for ever and ever. Amen.


