#### Dear friends,

As I mentioned last week, this coming Friday we will be celebrating the feast day of St. Agatha (which is actually the 5<sup>th</sup> Feb.). St. Agatha is, among other things, the patron

saint of those who suffer from breast cancer. With this in mind, we will be holding a women's breakfast (men can come along too) in the Presentation Centre, followed by a guest speak, Erin Heath, who will speak about the needs of sufferers and how we can be of assistance. Following Erin's talk, we will gather for Mass with the school community at 9am. For more details, please see the flyer which accompanies this newsletter. Please feel free to contact the parish office. We have also produced prayer cards for the feast day, and these will be available next weekend.

You may also remember that last year we raised money to support the work placement of a refugee through the MDA "Work and Welcome Program". This week, Omid started his ten week placement, which covers the parish, St. Agatha's primary school and St. Rita's College. Omid will be working in the parish on Tuesdays. This is an important initiative, and our parish is the first parish to participate in the program and the first time a tripartite arrangement has been developed with MDA. I thank you for your financial support to enable this placement to happen. Omid's story is on page two of this week's newsletter.

This week's gospel places before us the familiar text of the Beatitudes as the basic pattern of Christian life. I am grateful that our parish community is putting into action these virtues of Christian life through activities such as our breakfast on Friday and our support of refugees such as Omid. May these virtues of Christian living continue to be the mark of St. Agatha's parish community.

Finally, this weekend we welcome Fr. Orm Rush who will be regularly assisting with our weekend Masses. Fr. Orm is a world renowned theologian and teaches theology at ACU, and I am very grateful of his on-going assistance. Fr. Orm is no stranger here, and I am sure you will enjoy his homilies and his presence. Fr. Anthony

# **Clayfield Conversations**

MDA is an organisation which assists in the resettlement of refugees. One of their programs is the "Work and Welcome Program" which offers short-term employment placements for refugees to gain work experience. In conjunction with St. Rita's College and St. Agatha's Primary School, we are participating in this program during this first term. We welcome Omid among us who will be working in our parish one day per week until Easter.

# **Omid's Story**

Omid was born in central Iran (south of Tehran) in 1977 and is of a Persian background. As a child, Omid recalls that life in Iran was "good". Prior to the revolution in 1979, there was a strong university culture, plenty of opportunities for work and good jobs, and people enjoyed the resulting good economic conditions. Following the revolution, life changed in Iran.

After finishing high school, where he focussed on mathematics, Omid studied an Advanced Diploma in industrial drafting. Finding it necessary to leave Iran, Omid eventually made his way to Australia where he has been granted asylum. Omid settled in Brisbane to make a fresh start and enjoy the warmth of the Queensland weather.

As with many asylum seekers, Omid has faced many risks and dangers along the way. Now safely in Australia, Omid looks forward to securing a full time job. In the long term, Omid would like to complement and extend his education from Iran, with a view to becoming a civil engineer. During his time here working across the three placements (parish, primary school and St. Rita's), Omid aims to develop his work skills which he hopes will open the door to future prospects.

Omid says learning English is one of his biggest challenges. He is continuing to work on his language skills by watching TV and reading books. Reflecting upon his experience as a refugee, Omid believes that it is important that people be informed about the realities of life in other parts of the world, so that we can form a balanced and educated view about the vexed question of refugees and asylum seekers.

Omid's name means "hope" in Persian and he is very hopeful that his placement here, and working in our communities, will be a wonderful opportunity for him. He is looking forward to making connections and enjoying the friendly communities of St. Agatha's and St. Rita's. We warmly welcome Omid and we look forward to supporting him and accompanying him over the next ten weeks.
