Let us not stay imprisoned within ourselves, but let us break open our sealed tombs to the Lord – each of us knows what they are – so that he may enter and grant us life. Let us give him the stones of our rancour and the boulders of our past, those heavy burdens of our weaknesses and falls. Christ wants to come and take us by the hand to bring us out of our anguish.

The real miracle of Easter happens not in the darkened tomb. It happens in the darkened heart.

The real miracle of Easter happens not in the blocked cave. It happens in the blocked spirit.

The Easter light shines forth, the song of "Alleluia" rings out,

The praise of faithful witnesses fills the church, the hope of life is re-born.

You see, it was Mary Madeline who also experienced Resurrection on that first day of the week. A part of her had died on Good Friday. She had known the joy of healing because of Jesus; but it all seemed so short-lived – until now. She died with Christ and, she too, rose with him. Life, love, joy; Presence!

Joanna, Mary, the mother of James, and the other women, they came back to life too.

They didn't care that the men didn't believe them. They were alive, because Jesus was alive. They were transformed. The men would need to experience this for themselves. They would need to go to the empty tomb and look in. That's what Peter did. He ran, perhaps out of fear, probably out of shock, maybe out of hope. Nonetheless he ran. He stooped and looked in – there was nothing there, just cloth. He went home, amazed!

Or was he bewildered? Or confused? Or joyous?

Nonetheless he was transformed. Resurrection had happened to him too.

Now it is our turn. Are we ready? Have we prepared well-enough?

Have we asked God to lighten the heart, to unblock the spirit?

It doesn't matter. Christ didn't rise because Mary and Peter were ready. It was the last thing that they expected. And they most certainly didn't expect it to happen to them. But it did. That is how we know about the Resurrection – not

because Jesus told us, but because they did; they spread the news.

Today is the day, today is the feast, when we proclaim that Resurrection happens to you and me in our lifetime. Here and now. It happens slowly; it happens quickly. It happens modestly; it happens spectacularly. Either way it happens. Even if it is the last thing that we expect. God tells the big story of life, death and resurrection – indeed the *only* story worth telling – through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. God *keeps* telling it through us.

Resurrection is like this: its like the glimmer of forgiveness after the deep hurt; the success that brings a smile of self-esteem and a quiet glow of pride after all the endless failures;

the touch of a hand after the argument; the little laugh after prolonged grief;

the strength of character to start again after the loss of almost everything:

the courage to face the world after the shame of sorrow and remorse;

the hug of acceptance after the damage is done;

the force of healing which overcomes the despair of being mortal and frail;

the new beginning after every ending; and the love and friendship that makes living worthwhile.

Resurrection is faith when there is nothing to believe in. Resurrection is hope when hope is gone. Resurrection is love when our heart has broken. Resurrection is life's triumph – always! Because of Jesus, resurrection keeps happening to us too. In our life. In our day. Thank God.
