Dear friends,

Religion – faith – is sometimes understood as a fall-back position when life falls apart. People can see it as some kind of spiritual and emotional safety net. Sometimes this works for people, but often enough, people just become angry, or depressed, or bitter when life hits a hurdle. They feel denied the opportunities that they presumed were rightly theirs. This weekend, Jesus isn't talking about faith in him as a safety net. Quite the contrary; faith

in Jesus puts everything, success and failure, and everything in between, into perspective.

Jesus begins by saying, "The learned and the clever think they have everything worked out – everything sorted! But only fools think like that." Jesus then goes on to explain, "The truly wise discover divine wisdom, and let go of worldly wisdom." And we can only learn this divine wisdom through Jesus' eyes. And, then, perhaps the most startling thing for us, Jesus says, "It is those whose lives have been crushed, those who have been drained and wearied by what life has thrown at them, are the ones who are truly capable of understanding the Good News."

Failures, disasters, shattered dreams are the currency of gossip, rumours and denial. Particularly in these days of social media, our vindictive, nasty, judgemental streak comes to the fore. We hold people up to ridicule and shame. But all of us carry our own failures, disasters and shattered dreams. The voice that we long to hear is the voice of Jesus: "Come, have a rest. And we will work together and discover how you can overcome life's burdens." But this won't be a kind of success based on the world's definition. It will be a creative way forward that springs from the heart and mind of God. We not only search for that voice of Jesus in our lives, and are also commissioned to be that voice of Jesus for others. We are called to help carry one another's burdens. Our apprenticeship in discovering the voice of Jesus and being the voice of Jesus continues here at this Eucharist.

The Wisdom of Pope Francis

Let us ask ourselves if we are *parlour Christians*, who love to chat about how things are going in the Church and the world, or *apostles on the go*, who confess Jesus with their lives because they hold him in their hearts. Those who confess Jesus know that they are not simply to offer opinions but to offer their very lives. They know that they are not to believe half-heartedly but to "be on fire" with love. They know that they cannot just "tread water" or take the easy way out, but have to risk putting out into the deep, daily renewing their self-offering.

SOCIAL – Concerned for the social well-being of seafarers, we provide internet and telecommunications facilities, to allow them to keep in contact with their families, and recreational activities promoting their mental and physical health.

MATERIAL – Committed to social justice for all and believing in the dignity of the human person, we support seafarers in their right to fair remuneration, appropriate on-board accommodation, safe working conditions and non-discriminatory treatment by advocacy and working with other organisations.
