I am pleased to announce that Archbishop Mark Coleridge has appointed Fr Saji George CMI as Associate Pastor of St. Agatha's from the 12th August. I am sure that you will

welcome Fr. Saji when he arrives in the parish. The Congregation of Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI) is the first indigenous religious congregation in the Catholic Church of India. The CMI community is based in Kerala in India, and is part of the Syro-Malabar Catholic Church, which is an Eastern Catholic Church in full communion with Rome. There are a number of CMI priests currently serving within the Archdiocese, and Fr. Saji will share more of his story when he arrives.


Clayfield Conversations

Recently, the latest census data on religious affiliation was released. The Pastoral Research Office of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference has collated the census data.

2016 Census Data Reveals Growth, Diversity and Change in Population

The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) has just released data from the 2016 Census and the results reveal a growing, culturally diverse and changing population. On the night of the Census, there were 23.7 million people in Australia, with around 5.3 million people, or 22.6 per cent, identifying as Catholic. Anglicanism was the second largest religious group, with 13 per cent of the population identifying, while the Uniting Church comprised 3.7 per cent of the population. Not surprisingly, given the change to the Census form and previous Census trends, the number of people who identified with 'No religion' rose to 30 per cent of the population, while just under one in ten people chose not to answer the optional question. The number of people identifying as Catholic between 2011 and 2016 decreased by a nett amount of around 147,000, a decrease of 2.7 per cent. It is noteworthy that the 2016 Census was the first time in Australia's 105 year Census history that Catholic identification decreased in number.

While some commentators point to the latest Census results as further proof of the decline in the importance of religion amongst Australians and an increasing secularisation, it is worth noting that well over half the population (52.1%) identified with a Christian denomination and a further eight per cent with a non-Christian religion. According to the 2016 Census, the Catholic population in Australia is getting older. In the 2001 Census, 12 per cent of Catholics were aged 65 years and over. By 2006 this had risen to 13.2 per cent and 14.1 per cent by 2011. In 2016, 16.6 per cent of Catholics were aged 65 and over. Inversely, the proportion of Catholics aged 0-14 years decreased from 22.2 per cent in 2001 to 19.8 per cent in 2016. However, the Catholic population actually reflected the general Australian population, which also experienced an increase in the proportion of people aged 65 and over. Around 15.7 per cent of Australians were aged 65 and over in 2016.


