Clayfield Conversations

This Sunday we will hear from Archbishop Coleridge for the Catholic Campaign. Here is what I might have said about this weekend's Liturgy of the Word had I had the chance.

Fr. Anthony's Homily

St. Paul spent much of his life telling a story. When he came to places, he usually went to where people gathered, be it synagogues, or temples or bath-houses, and told the story of the death and resurrection of Jesus. He formed communities, stayed with them for a while and then moved on to do the same thing elsewhere. He wasn't always successful, but he continued, seemingly undiscouraged. Paul's great gift to the church was that he was able to give the Christian story a stable, community basis. He took the life and teachings of an itinerant preacher – Jesus Christ – and developed them into a way of life that communities could live by. When Jesus says, "Love another as I have loved you" Paul says, "Well this is what it means. This is how we live in love." When Paul was telling the story of Jesus to these communities and giving them a rule of life, there were no gospels to rely on. Most of Paul's letters where written before the gospels themselves. We have a clear example of that in this Sunday's letter to the Romans. The letter to Romans was written by Paul in Corinth, probably around the year 56/57 AD – so we are talking some 20-25 years after the death and resurrection of Christ. The first gospel was written down around 15 years after this, around 70 AD. But despite the time lag, the same stories come through. We don't know if Paul ever heard Jesus preach – he gives no indication that he did – but he clearly knows the message. "You must love your neighbour as yourself". These are Paul's words – but they are also Jesus' words. The answer to everything is love. If you love, you will keep the commandments. Notice that it is not the other way round. There is no guarantee if you keep the commandments, you will love. We can do all the right things, but we might never have learnt how to love. What is more important? – to learn to love through failure, or to be self-righteous through our own certainty about ourselves? Which brings us to the gospel. Most of us are experts in what other people should do - I know I am. Living someone else's life is so straight-forward most of the time. If only they did this, or they stopped doing that, or they made the most of this opportunity..., they would be happier, or better off or make it easier for everyone else or...whatever. We are blind and deaf to these same things that others say about us.

This gospel is prescriptive about how we live together as a community, but how many of us are really courageous enough to follow Jesus' advice. Let's have a look. Something happens in a relationship, a crossed-word, a frustration, a lapse in behaviour – there is some incident. What do most of us do? My experience is that we talk about it with everyone else except the person who has offended us. There are lots of conversations like, "Have you heard the latest? Did you hear what happened to him? Do you see what she did?" You know these situations. What does Jesus tell us to do? Go to the person who has offended us and "have it out with him or her alone, between your two selves". This is a good measure because it helps us decide how important the matter really is and whether it is worth taking the risk of confronting the other person. It is a step that makes us consider the depth of our hurt or otherwise; it is harder to pretend to be offended just to draw attention to ourselves. The flip-side is, we must be willing to be open to others when they approach us over something that we have done and be willing to apologise. If we are honest with ourselves, we must realise that we are as often the one who causes offence as the one who is offended.

Paul's great physical journey's are nothing compared to his great spiritual journey. It is his obvious and live-giving commitment to Christ which endures. He encouraged communities to live in the love which comes from Christ alone. May we hear that same message and live as a community founded on mutual love, friendship and respect.


ANNUAL CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN
