#### "WE WISH TO SEE JESUS"

"We wish to see Jesus." This was the request of the Greeks. They were not saying, "We would like to see the beautiful temple," or "We would like to have an audience with the high priest, Caiaphas." We don't come to church just to see a beautiful building or hear the choir or look at stained glass windows. We come here, saying, as the Greeks did, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." Why should we want to see Jesus? There are so many

reasons, but I will list a few here:

Jesus has the authority to forgive our sins. Salvation is found in no one but Jesus, the eternal Son of God. It is this Jesus who asked his disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" The answer came by divine revelation: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." It is this Jesus concerning whom the Father said at his baptism, "This is my Son whom I love; with him I am well pleased" (Matt. 3:17). It is this Jesus about whom God spoke again on the Mount of Transfiguration, saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased listen to him." That is why we must say with the Greeks, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus."

**Jesus is the Messiah.** He made this profound statement to the Samaritan woman in John 4:26 "I who speak to you am he," he told her, meaning, "I am the Messiah." There is no other messiah, no other saviour, no other deliverer. That is why we must say, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus."

*Jesus is the living bread.* In John 6:51 Jesus declared, "I am the living bread which came down from heaven," meaning, "I am the living bread for your soul, the one who came down from heaven. Others ate manna in the wilderness and died, but I have come down from heaven as the living Bread to make you alive." So we can say, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus, because he alone is the living Bread."

Jesus is the resurrection and the life, the beginning and the end. In John 11:25 Jesus told Martha, "I am the resurrection and the life," meaning eternal life is found in him alone. In Revelation 1:8 the resurrected Christ tells us, "I am the Alpha and the Omega. I am the First and the Last."

*Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life.* He is the only way to the Father.

These are but a few reasons why we should want to see Jesus. What about we? Do we wish to see Jesus? Lenten season is the right time to wish to see Jesus in our life. And if we really see him, our life will change. We will be transformed from a sinner to a saint and brought out of death and darkness into life and light. That is why we wish to see Jesus.

# PROJECT COMPASSION FOR A JUST FUTURE



Project Compassion enables us to contribute to creating a better world for others through our weekly giving. Each week during Lent, we will share a story from different parts of the world. This week we meet Ditosa from Mozambique .

#### Ditosa from Mozambique

Ditosa is a young girl from Mozambique who hopes to go to university and become a police officer. Featured in Project Compassion 2013, Ditosa faced a challenging future with food scarcity, little education and few job prospects. Cared for by her grandmother and aunt, after her parents died of AIDS-related illnesses, they also lost their home and livelihoods in severe flooding. Thanks to the support of Project Compassion, Caritas Australia and Caritas Regional Chokwe (CRC) helped Ditosa's family to build a new house and assisted with transport fees, school materials and fees, to help Ditosa to stay at school. Ditosa attended the Matuba Children's Centre daily (set up by Caritas in 2007) which provides vulnerable children, like Ditosa, with lunch, study help, and computer and income-generating skills training. In 2018, Ditosa has graduated from school and is ambitious for the future. "Without the support of the people from Australia and Caritas I would not have been given this opportunity to continue my schooling." Ditosa dreams of going to university to continue studying and secure an even brighter future.

You may remember that we are supporting a refugee family through MDA's Work and Welcome Program. Bahiya is working in our parish office on Tuesdays until May. Over the coming weeks we will read Bahiya's story which first appeared in The Catholic Leader last week. The story was written by Emily Ng.

#### Syrian Refugee Family Find Happiness in Brisbane (Part 1)



Syrian refugee couple Bahiya and Adnan Al Mhanna lost all their money and nearly their lives in Damascus, but for the first time in years they have something to smile about. The Melkite Catholic married couple along with their two sons are now celebrating their first offer of employment in Australia. The Al Mhanna family were among the 12,000 displaced Syrian and Iraqi refugees welcomed into Australia under the Federal Government's 2015 resettlement agreement. They narrowly escaped several bombings in their home city before finding refuge in Australia in late 2016. Late last year Mrs Al Mhanna, who received a degree in Modern History in Syria, began volunteering for Our Lady Help of Christians School, Hendra, where her two children Emil, 8, and Eilia, 5, attend. Within months principal Margaret Tomov, who has been a

pillar of strength for the Syrian family, offered the young mum paid work at the school. "I worked here as a volunteer first, and they gave me the first chance to work here in Australia in the tuckshop," Mrs Al Mhanna said. It's an enormous breakthrough for the Syrian family who are trying to forget the horrific life they left behind. Mrs Al Mhanna said the war zone in Damascus, the capital of Syria, left her "nervous and scared" and fearing for her children's life. "Death followed us everywhere," Mrs Al Mhanna said.
