Dear Friends,

This Sunday we offer a few welcomes to some newcomers. Firstly, we welcome Bahiya from Syria. You may remember that last year we raised money to support MDA's Work and Welcome program which helps refugees gain work experience in short-term placements. At the time, we raised enough money to fund a second placement, and so we have teamed-up with St. Rita's and St. Agatha's primary school again to offer another ten week placement to another trainee. Bahiya holds a Bachelor of Arts from Damascus University and speaks Arabic, English and French. Bahiya was forced to flee Syria with her young family because of the on-going and violent civil war. Even this week, the area of Eastern Ghouta, not too far from Damascus, continues to spiral into increasing brutality; over 250 people, including more than 50 children, have died in bombing raids during the last few days. We cannot change the past for Bahiya and her family, but we can support them into a more hopeful future. Thank you for your generosity in enabling Bahiya's placement in our parish office for the next ten weeks or so. Bahiya will be with us every Tuesday.

Secondly, we welcome three men from the seminary who will join us on their Sunday placements throughout the year at our 9am Mass. Tom Duncan, Emene Kelemete, and Josh Whitehead are all in their final year of seminary formation and, all going well, are towards diaconate ordination at the end of the year. Tom is preparing for Toowoomba diocese, Emene for Townsville diocese, and Josh for the Brisbane Archdiocese. Mostly, they will be visiting here as participants in Sunday Eucharist (9am), but over time they will be involved in various liturgical ministries, sacramental programs and the practice of preaching. I am sure that you will enjoy their presence here and that you will make them welcome.

Project Compassion enables us to contribute to creating a better world for others through our weekly giving. Each week during Lent, we will share a story from different parts of the world. This week we meet Rattanak from Cambodia.

Rattanak from Cambodia

The readings invite us to reflect on the transformative power of seeing more clearly and listening more deeply. The love which unites Jesus and the Father is the same love which embraces us.

The readings also point to a call to discernment and a desire to learn about the blessings God showers on us. St Paul asks the powerful question "With God on our side, who can be against us?" When we recognise that God is for us, we are transformed.

Rattanak's story featured this week by Caritas Australia's Project Compassion gives us a glimpse into a story of courage and transformation. Rattanak is twenty-nine and a barber in the village of Poh Krom in south-eastern Cambodia. From fever and becoming ill with polio as a child, Rattanak has some difficulty walking and is profoundly deaf. His sister discovered the Deaf Development Program (DDP), run by

Caritas Australia partner, Maryknoll Cambodia. It provides sign language, job training and interpreting services to people aged 16 and over who are deaf or hard of hearing and aims to raise awareness about deafness in the hearing community. So far, it's helped over 430 deaf or hard of hearing people with their education and more than 200 people to find jobs. It has also trained more than 300 people without deafness as sign language interpreters. Emerging from an isolated world at home in his early twenties, he gained skills at the Caritas supported Deaf Development Program. He can now use sign language to communicate and is now running a successful business, supporting himself, his wife and their newborn baby.

The program has been one of transformation for Rattanak. He can now understand and see the world in a whole new way. For Rattanak and other young people in his community, 'a just future' started with community. Listening to the scriptures today and to Rattanak's story has the power to transform us. We can be partners in working for a just future for everyone.
