Jesus said to his disciples, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more."

Dear Friends,

This time last year I was in the early stages of my Camino walk, crossing over the border between France and Spain on this day last year. We passed a marker that told us that it was 765 kms to Santiago. I won't claim that I walked that entire distance, but we still had a few good weeks of walking in front of us. Don't worry — I'm not going to relive every detail of the walk over the next few weeks (although I might). The point I would like to make is that it is remarkable how communities form, not only with my small band of fellow walkers, but also others who came and went along the Camino track. And even more so, our family, friends and communities back home who were also, in some mysterious way, accompanying us along the way. That is why this Sunday's gospel image of the vine is so powerful.

The gospel of the vine is Christ's great vision of interdependence. As Jesus describes, all things are linked together; the vine grower, the vine and the branches – nothings exists for itself. The energy of the vine grower goes into tending the vine; the vine grows because of the watchful care of the grower; and branches gain their very life and sustenance from the strength of the vine. This is the great web of interdependence, of parts working together and growing towards a natural harmony. Dead branches are removed to make way for new ones, even healthy branches are re-worked to encourage further growth and abundant fruit. It is a metaphor for our life together in the Spirit, our life with Christ – and the deep and mysterious bonds of the human family.

We can't come in contact with the vine without touching the branches. In other words, people's experience of Christ has got something to do with how they experience us. St. John prods our conscience today as he extols us, "Our love is not to be just words or mere talk, but something real and active." As we journey together, may our lives be a fruitful witness to this God of deep and mysterious communion, connections and interdependence.

# Clayfield Conversations



Pope Francis has given his formal approval for the church in Australia to hold a Plenary Council in 2020. Over the next couple of Sundays, we will explore the purpose of a plenary council through the thoughts of some of its key players. This article originally appeared in The Catholic Leader on 3rd April and was written by Mark Bowling.

## <u>Plenary Council Facilitator Lana Turvey-Collins urging all Church members</u> to speak 'from their heart and mind' (Part 1)

Lana Turvey-Collins does not shrink from the challenge of leading a high-stakes national conversation about the future of the Catholic Church in Australia. As the facilitator of the Church's historic Plenary Council 2020, she is leading a three-year "transformative journey" with the cultural reform of the Church on the table. "I am not naïve to the significant changes that many want," Mrs Turvey-Collins (pictured) said, referring to a Church faced with dwindling numbers, a shortage of priests, and rocked by the revelations of the Royal Commission into child sexual abuse. "If I didn't have hope then I wouldn't be in it. If I didn't have hope about the kind of Church Jesus talks about as Kingdom, why would I be in the role? "We invite all people to speak about whatever they want to speak about from their heart and mind."

A Queenslander, with strong academic credentials and with her own life-changing experiences in Africa, Mrs Turvey-Collins acknowledges the robust public debate the plenary will generate, and its ground-breaking potential. "Women's role in leadership in the Church is something personally relevant," she said. "I am a 39-year-old woman and if my husband and I have kids, I want our daughters to have a place in Church. "There is already so much great leadership going on and women every day in all sorts of places – lay women, religious women, Catholic teachers, nurses, doctors, scientists and theologians. "I think the listening and dialogue encounter means we can engage the voice in a way we maybe haven't experienced before."

The last plenary council, held in 1937, was an exclusively male gathering, with only bishops, theologians and superiors of male religious orders attending. The 2020 version has a different complexion with all-of-church participation from a richly diverse community, and the intent to discuss and legislate on a wide range of issues, including matters of faith, morals and discipline. "This is no time for the Church to be putting up signs that say 'business as usual'," Brisbane Archbishop Mark Coleridge said, as he announced the plenary council more than 18 months ago. He is chair of the Bishops' Commission for the Plenary Council.

"If we needed any proof, then the Royal Commission has shown that," Archbishop Coleridge said. "I think we have to ask questions about how we become a more missionary Church, and not a Church that is just retiring behind defensive walls. I think we have to ask questions about ordained ministry. The Church's response to the diminishment of our apostolic orders, the relationship between the newer communities and our older communities, by which I mean our parishes, the whole future of the parish is a major question. Do we need a new paradigm?" (Part 2 next week)
