My dear people, since God has loved us so much, we too should love one another. No one has ever seen God; but as long as we love one another God will live in us and his love will be complete in us.

#### Dear Friends,

Our culture uses the word "love" in all kinds of ways. "Love" is often used to describe our personal feelings towards someone, or something, or some activity. In our culture, it can be a feeling that is deep or shallow, lasting or permanent. Love is thrown around to describe how we feel about this or that.

There is a deeper dimension to love that our liturgical and Eucharistic world reminds us of this Sunday. Love is more than a feeling; it is an action. In the biblical world, the word "love" means "to do good". As the founder of the Jesuits, St Ignatius said, "Love is shown more by deeds than by words". For disciples of Jesus, love – our doing good – is the measure of our faith. Love isn't just an emotion that we respond to or have little control over; it is a choice, a decision. We must choose to love.

When Jesus says, "I give a new commandment," this commandment is new because the choice to love must be a new choice each day. Love is new with each new dawn. While love is a choice, it is impossible to force ourselves to love.

In the Christian sense, we can only speak of love because we have first been loved. God makes a choice to love us; not because we are good or because we deserve God's love or have proved ourselves to be worthy, but because God first chooses to love us. We are filled with a love that comes to us from the outside, from beyond us, as a gift, a deep sense of God's choice for us – even if we don't always choose to love in return.

We celebrate this eucharistically – the gifts of bread and wine are transformed into the gifts of God's love made real in the person of Jesus Christ. It is Jesus' love that we are drawn to – this commandment to make a choice to love each new day and to allow our words about love to become our deeds of love. Love is the pattern of how we are to live and the foundation of our relationships. *Fr. Anthony* 

#### **The Wisdom of Pope Francis**

We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, wherever we find ourselves. Are you married? Be holy by loving and caring for your husband or wife, as Christ does for the Church. Do you work for a living? Be holy by labouring with integrity and skill in the service of your brothers and sisters. Are you a parent or grandparent? Be holy by patiently teaching the little ones how to follow Jesus. Are you in a position of authority? Be holy by working for the common good and renouncing personal gain.

## **Clayfield Conversations**



Pope Francis has given his formal approval for the church in Australia to hold a Plenary Council in 2020. Over the next couple of Sundays, we will explore the purpose of a plenary council through the thoughts of some of its key players. This article originally appeared in The Catholic Leader on 3rd April and was written by Mark Bowling.

#### <u>Plenary Council Facilitator Lana Turvey-Collins urging all Church members</u> <u>to speak 'from their heart and mind'</u> (Part 2)

The starting point for Plenary 2020 will be an official launch on Pentecost Sunday (May 20), with an invitation to Catholics and Catholic organisations to provide their views, through a range of meetings and online kits - downloadable from a plenary council website that goes live in May.

This "listening and dialogue" stage will take a year, and Mrs Turvey-Collins expects "tens of thousands of responses", but if there is to be one overarching question for the Church, she believes it is: "What do you think God is asking of us in Australia?"

"And anybody can answer that: whether you've got a theology degree or not, whether you're a five-year-old or a seventy-year-old, you can engage in that question," she said.

"It is important that we try to enable as many parts of the Catholic Church, all of that diversity of health, social services, education, parish-based, curia, agencies, media, as well as those who somehow aren't in any of those places, who in a survey can't even decide whether they tick Catholic or not."

Mrs Turvey-Collins grew up in Beenleigh, south of Brisbane, attended St Joseph's primary school and Trinity College. She remembers growing up experiencing the Church as a community, with a sense of belonging grounding her faith.

"My mum was the head of the presbytery in the parish and we always had priests and sisters and brothers around in our lives," she said.

As a student, she spent a year in Japan, studied commerce and arts at the University of Queensland and at 22 years old moved to Sydney to work for a company running a global exchange program for traineeships.

By her late twenties, after extensive work in sales and training, she set a trail-blazing course as director of Catholic Mission in the Sydney archdiocese. "I was the first layperson in the role, and I was under 30, and I was female – so it was a little bit of culture shock," she said.

With no background working for a Church organisation, Mrs Turvey-Collins set about "learning the business" by talking to Church leaders.

"I began a journey of not only learning about the Church in Australia but learning about mission. Catholic Mission was encouraging, nurturing and let me explore," she said. (*Part 3 next week*)
