Dear Friends,

The journey towards the Plenary Council 2020 is officially launched this Pentecost Sunday. Pope Francis has given his permission for the Church in Australia to celebrate a Plenary Council in late 2020, with a second session in early 2021. A plenary council is a particular gathering of members of the church with the specific aim of making deliberative and binding decisions about the future direction of the Catholic Church in Australia. These decisions will ultimately need to be ratified by Rome. There are three phases: preparation; celebration; implementation. We are beginning the preparation phase. The aim of this preparation phase is simply to listen to as many voices as possible in response to this short yet complex question: *"What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?"* Have a think about your answer, because soon we will be asking for your responses. And we want to cast the net as widely as possible so that the most distant and quietest voices can be heard.


Pope Francis has spoken of the need to engage in the world and respond in faith. He said: The defining aspect of this change of epoch is that things are no longer in their place. Our previous ways of explaining the world and relationships, good and bad, no longer appears to work. The way in which we locate ourselves in history has changed. Things we thought would never happen, or that we never thought we would see, we are experiencing now, and we dare not even imagine the future. That which appeared normal to us – family, the Church, society and the world – will probably no longer seem that way. We cannot simply wait for what we are experiencing to pass, under the illusion that things will return to being how they were before.

#### PLENARY COUNCIL 2020 – LISTEN TO WHAT THE SPIRIT IS SAYING.

Pope Francis has approved the Australian Bishops' decision to hold a Plenary Council in Australia in 2020 and 2021. It is a significant moment for the Church in Australia to make decisions about the future. To prepare the agenda for the Plenary Council, all of God's people are invited to reflect on the question: "What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?"

Today, Pentecost Sunday, is the official launch of the preparation phase of the Council. Below is Archbishop Mark Coleridge's encouragement and invitation to be part of the Plenary Council process.

#### An Invitation from Archbishop Mark Coleridge

This year as we celebrate Pentecost we will also officially launch the journey of the Plenary Council. The journey really began back in May 2016 when the bishops decided to move towards the Council, and now after two years of preparation we are in a position to have a more formal launch. It is essential that the Plenary Council be seen not as administrative or political but as spiritual and ecclesial. The decision was made by the bishops but under the influence of the Holy Spirit; and the Holy Spirit will have to be our guide at every step of the journey. We are drawn into a process of discernment of what God is asking of us in Australia at this time, and that process will demand deep and constant prayer – a listening to God – from the entire Catholic community.

The Church was born of the Spirit at Pentecost, and we are now in search of a new birth as we look to the future. Birth can be painful and messy, but if this process is the work of the Holy Spirit it will lead to peace and hope and joy. Beyond this Pentecost launch, I urge you to enter wholeheartedly into the consultation process which now begins, so that as many voices as possible can be heard as we seek to shape the Plenary Council agenda. Keep in mind that the journey of the Council has three phases: preparation, celebration and implementation. The preparation phase has already begun; the Council will be celebrated in two sessions, one in October 2020 and the other is early 2021; and the implementation phase will stretch far beyond that.

In the Archdiocese I have convened a Plenary Council Task Force, who will promote and coordinate all our efforts at the local level and who will work closely with the national Plenary Council Executive Committee. I might also mention that in the second half of 2019 there will be an Archdiocesan Assembly to prepare for the Plenary Council, and the Archdiocesan Task Force will oversee the preparation of this. So the journey has already begun, and we pray this weekend that the Holy Spirit who has inspired us to begin this great work will guide us on the way and bring us to a point where our mind and heart are one with God's.
