All who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God.... When we cry, "Abba! Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ.

Dear Friends,

This weekend we welcome into full membership the first group of our children who are celebrating First Communion. They, and

their families, have been eagerly preparing over recent weeks and we have accompanied them with our prayers and support. They are now ready to feast at the Table of the Lord and we share their delight. May this food and drink be a constant source of spiritual nourishment and communal support.

Don't forget that this coming Friday is the closing date to RSVP for our centenary High Tea. It is sure to be a memorable gathering and one of the "high-points" of our centenary year. Gather your friends together and organise a table — and don't forget to invite former parishioners who might wish to return for this celebration. It will be a wonderful way to spend a winter's afternoon. All the information is on the promotional flyers which can be found on the pews.

Today is the feast of the Holy Trinity. This is not some abstract idea but a mediation about how the people of God have experienced and come to understand God throughout the ages. At the heart of the doctrine of the Trinity is the gift of Love: the love of the Father and Son in the Spirit; the love of the Spirit that turns our hearts towards love; and the love of one another which flows forth from this gift of the Spirit. This was really the theme of the showstopping sermon from last week's Royal wedding. As Bishop Michael Curry said, "There's power in love to help and heal when nothing else will", and he went to say, "When love is the way, then no child would go to bed hungry in this world ever again." With love, he said, "poverty will become history" and "the earth will become a sanctuary," and then ended with, "may God hold us all in those almighty hands of love". The Son and the Spirit are the two hands of the Father who reach out to us in love. So there is no need to be caught-up in tricky mathematical formulas, or mind-bending theories, just a simple reflection on the power of love gets to the heart of what the doctrine of the Trinity is all about. *Fr. The Wisdom of Pope Francis

Every saint is a message which the Holy Spirit takes from the riches of Jesus Christ and gives to his people. To recognize the word that the Lord wishes to speak to us through one of his saints, we do not need to get caught up in details, for there we might also encounter mistakes and failures. Not everything a saint says is completely faithful to the Gospel; not everything he or she does is authentic or perfect. What we need to contemplate is the totality of

the Gospel; not everything he or she does is authentic or perfect. What we need to contemplate is the totality of their life, their entire journey of growth in holiness, the reflection of Jesus Christ that emerges when we grasp their overall meaning as a person.

Clayfield Conversations

The late Bishop Ken Untener was bishop of Saginaw in the United States. He was an excellent homilist. Here is his homily for Trinity Sunday which was originally given in the year 2000.

Trinity Sunday Homily by Bishop Untener

I don't think we sit back often enough, and take in with wonder and awe, and enjoyment, the truths that God has revealed to us. You see, if we understand these great truths, it changes everything. That's what makes us act differently. That's what causes us to want to follow the Way of the Lord. It's because of the way we see things. Now for example, the Trinity. On this Sunday we celebrate the feast of the Trinity. Here's a way of looking at it that you might find helpful.

The universe bears the imprint of God, and if you want to get clues as to what God is like, look around at what God created. When we look around at this universe, what do we see? We see multiplicity... variety... beauty... interconnectedness... motion... liveliness... life. Now that gives us a clue as to what God is like. That's why we speak of God as a trinity of persons in which there is multiplicity... variety... beauty... inter-connectedness... motion... liveliness... life. God is not some immobile being looking out with a blank stare. We can't describe God except to use analogies. God is all the wonderful beauty of this universe. God is all the wonderful relationships of a people who love one another. That's why we teach God as more than a solitary person. God is the Trinity.

Did you ever wonder why, in the human race, everyone has an instinct for family, for relationships? It's in our blood. It's in our bones. That's because we're made in the image and likeness of God, and we have it in us to connect with other people – not to be solitary folks – but to have relationships, to experience loving and being loved.

Now the wonderful thing is, you and I have been made part of God's own family. We're part of the life of the Trinity. That's why I think of the first reading (the words of Moses): "Did anything so great ever happen before? Was it ever heard of?" Well, it is almost too good to be true... us being part of God's own family.

If you want to understand God, take all the beautiful thoughts of Mothers Day and the beautiful thoughts of Fathers Day, and feelings too, and roll those all together, and you have an experience of what God is like. You have a sense of God.

So that's all I have to say to you. I have no, "Therefore, go out and do this... therefore do that." I simply want all of us to appreciate the wonder of this god whom we call God, this god who created us in the same image and likeness of God...this god whose fingerprints are in the universe. When we appreciate this, then this is a God with whom we want to spend time with. This is a God we want to be close to. And this is a God to whom we want to give thanks and enjoy with wonder and awe. We do that in many different ways. Most of all we do it together when we gather at Eucharist, which is the Greek word for "Thanksgiving." As we celebrate this Eucharist this morning, keep in mind who it is who is with us. And keep in mind who it is that we hold in our hand at communion. It is the Lord Jesus who is the sacrament of God's presence, which means it is God. Give thanks to this God. God bless you.
