Jesus said, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

Dear friends,

The last major Allied offensive of World War I had begun only a few weeks before. Whether it had become known or not back home at that stage, the German army was in retreat, and World War I would formally end in a few

months time. On August 12th, 1918, Australian Commander Lieutenant General John Monash was knighted on the battlefield by King George V. The day before, back on our home turf, a fledgling community gathered to lay the foundations of what in time would become St. Agatha's Parish. One wonders what was on the mind of the community that gathered on that day: no doubt some had lost sons or brothers to battle; no doubt some feared for the safe return of those they loved; perhaps some wondered what was the point of praying to the Prince of Peace; probably, for most, the power of a local Christian community based in the sacrament of the Eucharist offered a great source of courage, strength and hope.

One hundred years and one day later, we are summoned by God of the Prince of Peace to once again place our trust in Divine goodness amid our own days of uncertainty and perplexity. The Eucharist is fundamentally an act of thanksgiving; an active praise of all that God has given us. As that first community gathered with their own prayers welling in their hearts, God does today what has been enacted every Sunday since that first Mass in the parish in September, 1918: we share in the gift of the Living Bread, Jesus Christ. A foundation stone is one thing: our living foundation is another story all together. This parish community is built on the living foundation stones of faith of those who have shared in the gift of Eucharist, who have generously given of their time, talents and resources, who have served those in need of one kind or another, who have taught and passed onto the children of this parish the power of the Gospel and the value of a community of love, who have accompanied one another in friendship and companionship, who have challenged one another, and who have laughed, cried, sung and prayed together. When Jesus speaks of being "the Living Bread", this is exactly what he means. On this centenary of the laying of our Foundation Stone, we give thanks that everything that St. Agatha's parish offers us, and our corner of the world, is done on memory of him our true foundation, Jesus Christ. ## **Clayfield Conversations**

## Of Stone and Bread

Don't build your house on sand the wise person said. For what is sand but ground down stone?

Choose a stone, a rock, an unshakeable foundation, that won't crumble away, whither into dust, or be worn down. But where in this age, in this world, would one find such stability, such certainty, such permanency? Isn't all in flux, in flow, in contradictory and complex paradox? Was that wise person just an illusionary dreamer, a voice from a different age, a non-credible witness?

Another wise saying: Mortals do not live on bread alone. Of course we don't, but we are still spoiled for choice: white, brown, sprouted grain, wholegrain, multigrain, gluten-free, sourdough, rye. And that's just bread, so we could live on just breads alone; another saying seemingly past its used by date.

A thought useful for our grand-parents, not for us moderns.

Now today, among this great, gathered crowd, we hear stories of "foundation stones" and "living bread", but we could just as truly speak of "foundation bread" and "living stones". The ancient wise person remains wise, reminding us that passing things come and go. That which is just bread remains just bread; no matter how we try, we know it is not enough to give us life and soon becomes stale. And that which is ground down, withered, weathered, unstable, in flux and flow cannot provide the ground for a house, a home, a shelter, a family, a community, a people.

What is, then, this space, here? Here, we are served "living bread" baked on "foundation stones". Only here, in some unspoken way, something, almost silently but not quite, calls my name. I hear, too, the echoed names of others. I hear whispered prayers from both voices I recognise and voices unfamiliar.

In this place, I see the hopeful young, comfortable in the embrace of kin but straining to be somewhere else. I see families trying to find their way, to be faithful while open to every opportunity. I see visitors passing through, transient but still fully members. I see the sad whose bones are aching in grief, sorrow, shame or loss. I see those whose joy is contagious and fill the space with light. I see those whose hopes are high with new beginnings. I see the tireless, silent servant who works, giving everything to others in selfless sacrifice. I see the carers who come for some short respite but must return to those who demand their energies. I see those scarred by life's unfairness, hampered by a greater incompleteness than most. I see the lonely who simply come to breath the air with fellow human beings. I see the searcher who is here but not sure why. I see the empty-hearted whose faith has long since deserted them. I see the old who feel at home and whose minds drift towards our true homeland – but not yet Dear Lord! I see the space where people used to be – either gone to God or gone away or gone to somewhere else.

But still, thank God, I see.

This scene is today. It is yesterday. It is tomorrow. Time and generations are mixed and mingled, here and there, *passim* in Latin. These are God's foundation stones who are nourished by God's living bread, for this is real food for real people for real life.

Fired in the ovens of the everyday, this bread becomes life precisely because it is crushed, grounded. But then it is kneaded, shaped and baked by Divine hand. Even in fragments, we too are living bread: For the stones on which we are baked are flared with memory; white-hot, piercing and powerful.

Today is a day of stones and bread; not cold and stale, but living and fresh. This foundation is not of sand but born from the powerful Memory that makes Present the Promise of Life which satisfies our hunger. Today, we need only to look around to taste and see the goodness of the Lord.
