HAPPY PATRON SAINT'S DAY TO ALL PARISHIONERS, YOUR FAMILIES AND FRIENDS.

I hope you are able to attend the Parish gathering at St Agatha's Primary School after the 9.00am Mass today. Much preparation has gone into the activities and refreshments that will be available.

No doubt after the wonderful Parish centenary celebrations last year many people are now more familiar with the story of St Agatha. Born in Sicily around 231 she was a young woman of devout Christian faith. According to legend she was the daughter of a prominent family and was very beautiful. The Roman prefect Quintianus, who was of low birth, wished to marry her but Agatha refused him. As Christians were being persecuted under the Roman Emperor Decius Quintianus had Agatha arrested and taken before the judge. He was the judge! Despite being sent to a brothel, undergoing terrible torture and having her breasts removed Agatha remained faithful to her love of Jesus Christ and her belief in Christ's constant companionship. Agatha is believed to have died in prison in 253. The word Agatha comes from the Greek word for *good* and the life-story of this good and courageous woman soon spread and become a source of inspiration to many people who face all sorts of challenges. Because of the torture Agatha experienced she is the patron saint of those who are living with breast cancer. In Sicily this week, especially in Catania where Agatha is buried there will be at least three days of celebrations! A lovely coincidence is that relatives of parishioners of St Agatha's Clayfield are residents of Catania in Sicily. What is the significance of a Patron Saint? I suppose that is best answered by asking what's in a name. I have never known a parent to explain the choice of their child's name by saying it was the first thing that came to mind. Much time and love goes into that profound choice for the child and the bible tells us that God knows each of us by name. Well we carry the name Agatha as does our primary school and many parish ministry groups. May her love of Jesus and her bond to all who carry her name and story inspire goodness and courage in everything we say and do. Fr Kevin

HISTORICAL CONTEXT - Theophilus

The gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles are written by the same person, or at least the same community. They are often regarded as a single work - Luke-Acts - as one flows directly into the other. Both books begin with an inscription to Theophilus. The Greek name, Theophilus, translates as 'lover of God'. Some scholars suggest that the name is a pseudonym for any lover of God or someone in particular whose identity must be shielded. Other argue that Theophilus was an influential Roman who had taken a great interest in the early Christian movement.

Nazara was a village of 300-400 people and it had a small town mentality. The inhabitants were enraged when Jesus found good precedent for extending his saving mission to foreigners outside the community of the Chosen People. Jesus embodied the boundary-breaking nature of God's grace.

Many Christians recite the old formula: 'No salvation outside the Church.' But we Catholics believe that, by responding to God's (often anonymous) grace, a person can lead a good life which prepares them for heavenly glory.

This means that the billions around the world who will never hear the Gospel, or who hear it distorted through the megaphone of an alien culture, can be saved. There is no limit/boundary to the Merciful God's finding a way into the hearts of all human beings.

We could take a moment to pray in gratitude for our graced privilege of being members of the Church, nourished within it by the Sacraments and the Gospel, but whose boundaries can never circumscribe the mercy of God. © Fr Michael Tate
