Dear friends,

Firstly, thank you for the very warm welcome I have received since arriving in the Parish. Spirit Seminary and Pastoral Director of those students participating in a year of pastoral placement. While having supervised students in the Parish several times it will be a new experience for me to be directly involved in the formation of those preparing for ordained ministry.

Secondly, I admire the generosity of St Agatha's Parish which for many years has shared its Pastor with another ministry in the Archdiocese or the Province of Queensland. Fr Anthony and Fr Adrian held positions which served the wider church and that will continue as I am involved at Holy Spirit Seminary. Not every faith community would be so generous and I am grateful for your patience and understanding as I attempt to get the balance right.

I have met quite a few people from Clayfield Parish over the years as I was pastor at Caloundra for seven years and before that appointment I was eighteen years at Coolangatta- Tugun Parish on the Gold Coast. I am the second of three sons and was born in Charleville, Queensland in 1961. I grew up in Ipswich, was educated at St Edmund's Christian Brothers and ordained in February 1986 at St Mary's Ipswich.

One very positive aspect to being back in Brisbane is the possibility of attending a Broncos game because Murphy, my Border Collie, doesn't cope very well when the master gets excited while watching a televised game of real football! I hope this New Year has already been a time of blessing for you and may that continue.

Someone more powerful is coming. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. You are my Son, the Beloved. My favour rests on you. Prepare. Make straight. Here is the Lord coming with power. The earth is full of your riches. You renew the face of the earth.

The gospel speaks of two baptisms. The first is the event this feast celebrates: the baptism Jesus received. The second is the baptism with the Holy Spirit and fire which we receive. Just as Jesus' baptism revealed him as 'beloved Son', our own baptism reveals us as ones who are saved, renewed, justified, and heirs of eternal life. In this sense baptism is an epiphany.

The Baptism of the Lord

What did it mean for Jesus to come up out of the waters of the Jordan to experience the special presence of the Holy Spirit as though it were a dove, gently hovering over him? As a Jew, he would have been reminded both of the Divine Wind hovering over the void-become-creation, and of the dove bearing an olive twig as God restored humanity's life on earth after the Flood. The Holy Spirit was empowering Him for a re-creative role on behalf of humanity.

His second experience was to sense God's delight and joy sounding, reverberating through every fibre of his body, every reach of his soul: 'You are my beloved Son, my favour rests on you.'

Any baby, any adolescent, any adult who is baptised shares in these wonderful experiences. The dynamic power of the Holy Spirit hovers over the person as a gentle presence, preparing the one baptised for a mission on behalf of humanity. And every baptised person senses, below the range of hearing, the echo of the same marvellous words: "You are my beloved son or daughter, my favour rests on you."

Is it any wonder that Our Lord adopted this water rite to incorporate his followers into such wonderful experiences as a power-full impetus to fulfil their mission to cooperate in God's saving plan for humanity?

We could take a moment to pray in gratitude for the parent/s or other person/s who brought us into this tradition stretching over almost two millennia. May they be filled with all that flows from their being beloved sons and daughters of God.
