

The readings today prepare us for the coming Lenten season, a time for prayer, fasting and almsgiving. It is also a time for stepping away from the instinct to judge one another, be that close to home, or beyond into the human family of nations.

The responsorial psalm speaks of how the proclamation of justice is nourishing, the work of justice is life giving. Caring for others keeps us connected to the spirit of God, reminding us that the just will 'flourish like the palm-tree and grow like a cedar of Lebanon'.

The second reading urges us to 'never give in' and keep faithful to the Lord's work which is to ensure that there is justice among the nations and that peace will flourish. The gospel reading tells us that 'the fully trained disciple will always be like the teacher', reminding us that our example of living is to come from Jesus and his mission of bringing good news to the poor. It is by what we say and do, that people will see the face of God in the world. This is the "good" fruit.

In the coming weeks, we have the privilege of walking with some of our sisters and brothers who participate in Caritas programs, and who feature in the Project Compassion stories this year. How might we learn about living hope-filled lives in solidarity with one another and for the common good of our one human family?

As the season of Lent approaches, we might consider: What could we do to commit ourselves to the flourishing of hope in our time? How can we give Lent 100%?

Clayfield Conversations

Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

UNDERSTANDING THE WORD - Looking inwardly - acting outwardly

The gospel today presents three unrelated sayings of Jesus which outline the qualities of a true follower of Jesus. The unifying theme is integrity - being honest and sincere with oneself and rejecting all forms of deception, superficiality, falseness or hypocrisy. In questioning the sense of a blind man leading the blind, Jesus is speaking to the importance of leaders having experienced a situation themselves before presuming to guide other people.

The instruction to remove the log from one's own eye before commenting on the splinter in another's eye, is a clear call to judge self and others honestly and fairly. Jesus speaks disparagingly of people who ignore their own failings while focussing on the faults of others and refers to them as 'hypocrites', a word which had previously been reserved for the Pharisees and scribes. Finally, in declaring that a good tree cannot bear bad fruit, and that a bad tree cannot bear good fruit, Jesus is emphasising that inward dispositions manifest themselves in external words and actions... *Liturgia*

Statement from Archbishop Mark Coleridge: re the verdict in the Cardinal Pell case

The news of Cardinal George Pell's conviction on historical child sexual abuse charges has shocked many across Australia and around the world, including the Catholic Bishops of Australia. The Bishops agree that everyone should be equal under the law, and we respect the Australian legal system. The same legal system that delivered the verdict will consider the appeal that the Cardinal's legal team has lodged. Our hope, at all times, is that through this process, justice will be served. In the meantime, we pray for all those who have been abused and their loved ones, and we commit ourselves anew to doing everything possible to ensure that the Church is a safe place for all, especially the young and the vulnerable.
