Happy Easter to everyone once again. This Sunday concludes the Octave of Easter. It is the experience of eight days as if they were one. The joy, hope and light of Easter Sunday spills over into the entire week; and it is not even the usual week. This week has eight days. The old life symbolic in the seven days of creation has now been surpassed by the dawn of the day of eternity, the eighth day made possible through Christ's resurrection and a day we now face with hope. This eighth day of the new creation is the promise of everlasting life in Christ our Risen Lord.

The Easter season continues until the feast of Pentecost. The forty days of fasting is also now surpassed by these fifty days of feasting. The Easter season is a perfect time for the celebration of the Easter sacraments, namely Confirmation and Holy Communion and here in our Parish we will be celebrating first Holy Communion at the end of May. In the meantime we keep the young people preparing for Holy Communion and their families in our prayers. A Parish faith community has no more important task than to educate and pass on the Sacraments for these are our life and celebration of the Risen Lord among us.

A very sincere thank you to all who made the Easter Triduum celebrations possible. Undoubtedly this most important celebration of our faith is also a busy time for many and celebrating these mysteries with the dignity they deserve demands much from the faith community. Many ministers served the community quite a few times over those days and I am very grateful for their generosity and willingness to be so available. The ceremonies would never be what they were without their attendance. To all proclaimers of God's Word, Holy Communion Ministers, Servers, church environment people, fire attenders, slide operators, welcomers, the office staff who prepared ceremonies, musicians and singers please accept our thanks and Easter good wishes.

### Clayfield Conversations

### **Second Sunday of Easter**

#### **New life**

Though the exact expression 'new life' does not occur in the New Testament, we frequently use it as a kind of 'shorthand' to describe both the kind of life to which Jesus was raised and what believers have because of Jesus. This Sunday's well-known gospel story conveys the idea of 'new life' using different images and vocabulary.

Jesus' new life is described by his ability to come to the disciples despite the locked doors. Though the marks of his death are clear, he is alive nevertheless. The risen Jesus greets the disciples with 'Peace', fulfilling his promise: 'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you' (John 14:27). Seeing him, the disciples rejoice, fulfilling another promise of Jesus: 'I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice' (16:22). Finally, Jesus commissions them by sending them into the world, fulfilling yet again another promise he made when speaking to his Father: 'As you sent me into the world, so I sent them into the world' (17:18). The reliability of Jesus' word is stressed for a reason, as we shall soon see.

Then the risen Jesus imparts life to them when 'he breathed on them' (20:22) and gave them the Holy Spirit. In the story of creation God breathed the breath of life into the clay man to make him a living being (Gen 2:7; the same Greek word (*emphusao*) is used in John 20:22 and the Greek version of Genesis). The disciples, then, are made anew, or are a new creation, infused with the Holy Spirit. The presence of the Spirit is both the sign of, and the power behind, their extraordinary mission: to forgive sins. Sent, as Jesus was sent, the disciples continue his work by forgiving sins. In the same way that all that Jesus had spoken has been proved true, the disciples (and readers!) are assured that the forgiveness of sins is accomplished.

The abundant signs of new life are these: peace, recreation by the gift of the Holy Spirit, the mission ('sent'), and the forgiveness of sins... *Liturgia*
