#### PLENARY COUNCIL NEWS.

Between May 2018 and March 2019 almost 17,500 submissions from individuals and groups of all sizes, addressed the Plenary Council's central question: "What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?"

Archbishop Costelloe, who is President of the Plenary Council, said there was a clear desire expressed for the Church to renew herself and focus on the person of Jesus Christ. "Accordingly, the six National Themes for Discernment flow from that primary goal of being a Christ-centred community of people," he explained. The six National Themes for Discernment invite people to reflect, to pray and to consider how God is calling the People of God to be a Christ-centred Church in Australia that is:

• Missionary and Evangelising

- Inclusive, Participatory and Synodal
- Prayerful and Eucharistic
- Humble, Healing and Merciful
- A Joyful, Hope-Filled and Servant Community

• Open to conversion, Renewal and Reform.

Plenary Council facilitator Lana Turvey-Collins said many topics relate to one or more of the National Themes for Discernment and this next stage of preparation -"Listening and Discernment" - is a time of prayerful consideration of the "big" questions that have been raised by the faithful.

Archbishop Mark and the Brisbane Archdiocese have now decided upon a way forward and the next step in our plenary process.

With the recent release of the six themes for discernment and the impending commencement of the listening and discernment phase of the Plenary Council journey, the Archdiocese of Brisbane will be hosting an Archdiocesan Assembly taking place on 4 and 5 October 2019 at the Edmund Rice Performing Arts Centre, St Laurence's College, South Brisbane.

This Brisbane Assembly will offer an opportunity for all who attend to take part in a process of communal discernment led by experienced facilitators. This will aid in empowering participants to engage their own parishes and communities with the second phase of the Plenary journey in the lead up to Easter 2020. The Assembly will also provide parishes and communities with a deeper understanding of the themes for national discernment as well hearing from the Plenary Council national facilitation team. Participants will hear from an array of quality presenters on 'Discernment' and 'Effective Communication' to assist with the Listening and Discernment phase.

So the Brisbane Assembly which will have several representatives from every parish in the Archdiocese is an important next step in the plenary process. Please pray for everyone involved in the preparations for the Assembly and I am sure we will hear more about the event as it approaches. God bless,

## **Clayfield Conversations**

### Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### Living the Gospel – Ask, Search, Knock

Jesus says in the gospel, 'Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you.' The actions of asking, searching and knocking are means by which we initiate the encounter with God. If we don't ask, search and knock, how is anyone (including God) to know our needs or know what it is that we are searching for. Particularly in our spiritual lives, it is only through the search and the knocking on the doors of different experiences that we ever come closer to finding answers.

### Historical Context – Stone for bread

The stone/bread, snake/fish and scorpion/egg comparisons seem a little farfetched to us, but would have made perfect sense to a 1st Century Palestinian audience. The flat, brown stones around Lake Galilee look very similar to the flat bread that was baked in the area. The 'snake' may refer to a sea-snake - an eel - which might be caught up in a fisherman's nets but was regarded as unclean by the Jews. The poisonous scorpions of the region are very pale in colour and when curled up at rest could be mistaken for an egg.




