Clayfield Conversations

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Connecting discipleship to decision

The difficulty in making a connection between the first reading and the gospel is obviated in the ecumenical Common Lectionary which offers a different passage from Jeremiah, 23:23-29. This passage describes the effectiveness of the authentic prophetic word: 'Is not my word like fire, says the Lord?' (23:29). 'Fire' is the image Jesus uses in the gospel to describe his mission. In, the bible, fire is sometimes an image for purification (e.g. Numbers 31:23; Ezekiel 22:19-22), but more often for judgment (Judith 16:17; Isaiah 66:16; Amos 7:4; 2 Pet 3:7). Intrinsic to the act of judgment is separating, that is, deciding for some and against others: the wicked are condemned and the righteous are saved. Or, in the words of Jesus, his ministry will cause division as some decide for him and some against him. But his very person and presence demand such a decision.

The close connection between judgment and division is spelled out in highly personal terms: households will be divided and familial relations will be disrupted. The peace of the status quo, or the peace that comes from avoiding a decision, is replaced by division. The judgment that Jesus brings is, ironically, one that people impose on themselves by deciding for or against Jesus.

From fire, Jesus moves to the image of the 'baptism with which I must be baptised', a reference to his passion (e.g., Mark 10:38). The images of fire and baptism refer to his mission, both in terms of the cost that it will exact from him and the decision it will require of people. Finally, these words spoken by Jesus on the way to Jerusalem where he will suffer and die recall the words of John the Baptist who had earlier spoken of the coming of one mightier than he who would 'baptise you with the Holy Spirit and with fire'. (Luke 3:16). As Jesus walks the road to Jerusalem, disciples must decide to go with him or not. To be with or against Jesus is a decision that has the effect of judgment and division... *Liturgia*








AUSTRALIAN CATHOLIC YOUTH FESTIVAL 2019
