On this third Sunday of Advent each year, John the Baptist features in the Gospel; only in Year A, however, do we encounter John in prison, near the end of his life. He has heard of the things that Jesus has done and said. John knows his life is likely to end very soon on the command of Herod, so he wants to make sure he has not been mistaken in identifying Jesus as the awaited one. He sends his disciples to ask Jesus, " Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to wait for someone else?"

Jesus' answer is that to see the signs of God requires noticing what is all around. Jesus tells John's disciples to tell their master what they had seen and heard, the signs of the messianic age: "the blind see...the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor". There is one more statement that Jesus makes about the signs he has produced to show the kingdom of God is at hand. He says, "happy is the [one] who does not lose faith in me". Does this refer to John? Is John wavering now that his life is in danger? Perhaps it is more likely that Jesus is describing John as the one who is most likely to see the signs of the Messiah's presence.

Those who go back to John will need to do more than tell what they have seen and heard. They must describe with conviction the signs they have seen indicating that the kingdom of God is at hand. So why did people not see these signs? Isaiah spoke of people who "Hear and hear again, but do not understand; see and see again, but do not perceive." John clearly doesn't come into that category. He is the one of whom Jesus says, "happy is the [one] who does not lose faith in me".

Congratulations to Brooke Gordon who is formally welcomed into the RCIA through the Rite of Acceptance. This will take place at the 9.00am Mass this weekend.

This ceremony also invites the Parish to encourage Brooke with our prayers and example as her preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation continues. We support her family as well and thank them for the faith they share with us and one another.

Clayfield Conversations

Third Sunday of Advent (Year A)

Scriptural context – John the Baptist

Jesus is not recorded as asking the messengers about John's wellbeing. He doesn't appear to express any concern about John's imprisonment. Yet Jesus must have felt this situation very deeply. John the Baptist and Jesus were related; they were cousins. The depth of his feeling is reflected when Jesus speaks so positively and powerfully about John. It reads almost as a eulogy that might be given at a funeral; praising the greatness of the deceased. Yet regardless of John's greatness, Jesus assures his audience that even the least in the kingdom is greater than John.

Living the Gospel – Gaudete!

The third Sunday of Advent was traditionally known as Gaudete Sunday. The word, gaudete, (pronounced gow-day-tay) is from Latin and means Rejoice! The name was given to this Sunday because the entrance antiphon for the day is: 'Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice! The Lord is near.' When Advent was observed as a more penitential season, this third Sunday was a break from the sombre mood and was more celebratory. The rose-coloured candle in the Advent wreath and rose-coloured vestments convey a mood of joy and celebration....Liturgy Help


