The Month of May

May is such a beautiful month. The whole month is dedicated to our Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Jesus, who assumed a special role in our lives and became a mother to us all. We specially honour the Blessed Virgin Mary during the entire month of May.



Mary is our loving mother. Her maternal heart is full of love and mercy for her beloved children.

She is blessed... she herself is nothing. God has, for our sakes, delighted to manifest His glory and His love in her. She placed no obstacle to the mercy of God and in no way resisted His love and His will

Mary, who was empty of all egotism, free from all sin, was pure, to admit the light of Jesus. **She constantly presents all our prayers to Jesus**. Mary is known as the "Gate of Heaven". We need Mary to guide us to heaven so that we may not lose our way by falling into sin.

We need to pray the Rosary every single day during the month of May. If one cannot pray the entire rosary with dedication, pray at least one decade faithfully, and if a decade is not possible, recite at least one Hail Mary with complete devotion.

When we pray the Hail Mary, ask our Heavenly Mother to intercede for us now and at the hour of our death. Yes, we need her powerful intercession during the last moments of our earthly life. Our Mother will help us during that hour. We only need to pray to her without ceasing.



FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER GOSPEL REFLECTION

The gospel readings for the Sundays just before the feast of Pentecost are all taken from Jesus' last discourse in the Gospel of John. In them, Jesus prepares his followers for his death and resurrection and his ultimate exaltation.

This Sunday Jesus says that it is through his death that he goes to God. However, it is as he is raised up in crucifixion that he is exalted. The author of the epistle declares him 'chosen and precious in the sight of God' but it is as the stone that was rejected that he is so honoured. If we ever wonder how the exaltation of Jesus will effect us, we have Jesus' own words of explanation. He promises to go ahead of us and make arrangements for us to share in his exaltation in the house of the one he calls Father. All we need do is follow him.

Today's readings suggest that the exaltation of Jesus is most dramatically manifested in the character of the community of those called by his name. It is revealed in the way Christians settle their differences so that all parties are treated fairly. Jesus is the cornerstone upon which this community is built, and the community mirrors his influence in its life. Christians also participate in the exaltation of Jesus by spreading the good news to others. LETTER OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS Rome, Saint John Lateran, 25 April 2020 TO THE FAITHFUL FOR THE MONTH OF MAY 2020

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The month of May is approaching, a time when the People of God express with particular intensity their love and devotion for the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is traditional in this month to pray the Rosary at home within the family. The restrictions of the pandemic have made us come to appreciate all the more this "family" aspect, also from a spiritual point of view.

For this reason, I want to encourage everyone to rediscover the beauty of praying the Rosary at home in the month of May. This can be done either as a group or individually; you can decide according to your own situations, making the most of both opportunities. The key to doing this is always simplicity, and it is easy also on the internet to find good models of prayers to follow.

I am also providing two prayers to Our Lady that you can recite at the end of the Rosary, and that I myself will pray in the month of May, in spiritual union with all of you. I include them with this letter so that they are available to everyone. (Note: the second prayer is quite long and not included in this week's newsletter)

Dear brothers and sisters, contemplating the face of Christ with the heart of Mary our Mother will make us even more united as a spiritual family and will help us overcome this time of trial. I keep all of you in my prayers, especially those suffering most greatly, and I ask you, please, to pray for me. I thank you, and with great affection I send you my blessing.

O Mary, You shine continuously on our journey as a sign of salvation and hope. We entrust ourselves to you, Health of the Sick, who, at the foot of the cross, were united with Jesus' suffering, and persevered in your faith. "Protectress of the Roman people", you know our needs, and we know that you will provide, so that, as at Cana in Galilee, joy and celebration may return after this time of trial. Help us, Mother of Divine Love, to conform ourselves to the will of the Father and to do what Jesus tells us. For he took upon himself our suffering. and burdened himself with our sorrows to bring us, through the cross, to the joy of the Resurrection. Amen.

We fly to your protection, O Holy Mother of God; Do not despise our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us always from every danger, O Glorious and Blessed Virgin.
