Let us join in thanking and praying for our Nation in celebration of Holy Mass

Your safety is always our first priority and we need to keep everyone COVID-safe In the liturgical year it is the third week in ordinary time.

Just as a typical calendar has four seasons, twelve months, fiftytwo weeks, and 365 days that include holidays, solemn days, commemorative days, and days that are just ordinary, the Liturgical Year Calendar of the Church uses similar terms and measurements.

The Liturgical Year is marked by special seasons: Advent, Christmas, Lent, The Paschal Triduum or Three Days, Easter, and Ordinary Time.

The purpose of the Liturgical Year Calendar is not to mark the passage of time, but to celebrate and understand more fully the entire mystery of Jesus Christ, from his incarnation and birth until his ascension, the day of Pentecost, and the expectation of his return in glory. During the course of a year, the Paschal Mystery: the passion, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus, is viewed from different angles, in different lights.

First of all, each of the three years is dedicated to a different Gospel.

Year A – Gospel of St. Matthew, Year B – Gospel of St. Mark, Year C – Gospel of St. Luke

The Gospel of St. John is typically used for solemnities and during Holy Week, and the shorter Gospel of Mark is usually supplemented with readings from Matthew and Luke in Year B.

The seasons of the liturgical year begin with Advent, a time of preparation (4 weeks) for the Christmas season. The Christmas season celebrates the birth of Jesus (on December 25) and continues until the Baptism of Our Lord. This is followed by the first of two periods of Ordinary Time, which continues until Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent, a time of penitence leading to the Paschal Triduum after the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. The Triduum is the three days before Easter. Easter Sunday marks the start of the Easter season, which continues as a time of celebration until Pentecost Sunday. Pentecost Sunday marks the start of the season begins again.

This year the season of Lent starts on **Wednesday**, **February 17**. We celebrate Ash Wednesday on 17 February.
