
Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time 30/31 January 2021

Feast day of the week

31 JANUARY: St. John Bosco (Don Bosco)

St. John Bosco led Young People to Meet Christ by means of his educational style and pastoral practice, based on reason, religion and loving kindness. He led young people to reflect, to meet Christ and their brothers and sisters, to the study of the faith and to the apostolic, civil and professional commitment. St. Dominic Savio stands out among the most outstanding fruits of his work.

2 FEBRUARY: The Presentation of the Lord

Celebrated forty days after Christmas, commemorating the prescribed Mosaic ritual following the birth of a child, and recalling the encounter of Jesus with Simeon and Anna in the temple.

In fulfilling the Law (Lev 12:1-5; Lk 2:22-40) Joseph and Mary presented Jesus to the temple where they met Simeon and Anna. Both of them received a revelation from God concerning Jesus and they witnessed to His identity as Messiah in order to give a new sanctity to human existence

5 FEBRUARY: St Agatha, virgin, martyr

Died in Sicily, perhaps during the persecutions of the third century. Venerated as a virgin martyr on this day since the sixth century and included by name in Eucharistic Prayer I (The Roman Canon). Remembered in legend for her faith and for remaining resolute under torture.
