Feast of St Agatha

Our Parish Heavenly Patroness

St. Agatha is a virgin-martyr of the early Church. From her very early years, the notably beautiful Agatha dedicated her life to God. She became a consecrated virgin, a state in life where young women choose to remain celibate and give themselves wholly to Jesus and the Church in a life of prayer and service. That did not stop men from desiring her and making unwanted advances toward her.

However, one of the men who desired Agatha, whose name was Quintianus, a high diplomatic ranking, forced her to turn away from her vow and marry. He tortured her to possible death, but she simply reaffirmed her belief in God by praying: "Jesus Christ, Lord of all, you see my heart, you know my desires. Possess all that I am. I am your sheep: make me worthy to overcome the devil." With tears falling from her eyes, she prayed for courage.



To force her to change her mind, Quintianus had her imprisoned - in a brothel. But she never lost her confidence in God, even in her long suffering and pain. Quintianus heard of her calm strength and during her interrogation, she told him that to be a servant of Jesus Christ was her true freedom.

Again, Quintianus ordered her to be tortured. He had her stretched on a rack to be torn with iron hooks, burned with torches, and whipped. Noticing Agatha was enduring all the torture with a sense of cheer, he commanded further torture.

He then sent her back to prison with an order of no food or medical attention. But the Lord gave her all the care she needed. He was her Sacred Physician and protector. Agatha had a vision of the apostle, St. Peter, who comforted her and healed her wounds through his prayers.

After four days, Quintianus ignored the miraculous cure of her wounds. When she was returned to prison, Agatha prayed, "Lord, my Creator, you have ever protected me from the cradle; you have taken me from the love of the world, and given me patience to suffer: receive now my soul."

This sadly was the reality for many back in those days, to endure such horrific suffering through what we would consider today to be archaic methods of torture. I know this is hard to read but I wanted to share the truth of what St Agatha sacrificed for her faith. For all her suffering she is known as the patron saint of Sicily, bell founders, breast cancer patients, Palermo, rape victims and wet nurses. She is also considered to be a powerful intercessor when people suffer from fires.



Word of God Sunday

The Church in Australia will celebrate the Sunday of the Word of God on the first Sunday in February each year, starting with February 7 in 2021. Pope Francis last year instituted the celebration when issuing the apostolic letter Aperuit Illis. The letter encouraged the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God.

Who the campaign is for:

You may have already begun to see or hear advertising on billboards, the radio, and social media encouraging the 700,000+ Catholics in this region to think about what it means to be a Baptised Catholic.

All Catholics, with a particular focus on the 90% of Catholics who for whatever reason do not regularly engage with the faith community, are being encouraged to get in touch with the adult formation team of the Archdiocese to receive support, as they seek to know more about what their baptism might mean for them.

spond to the campaign and accompanying people who have responded to the campaign.
