Covid 19 updates

- Masses and Gatherings: 1 person per 2 square metres in the church
- Weddings and Funerals, when held indoors, will return to one person per 2 square metres or 200 people, whichever number is lower.
- **Food Service**: There are no restrictions on selfservice food; eating and drinking while standing is
- 4. Mask wearing requirements will continue to apply until 4pm Friday the 10th September 2021. You must carry a face mask with you at all times when you leave home, unless you have a lawful reason not to.
- **Indoors:** You must wear a mask in indoor spaces (including places of worship and workplaces) unless it is unsafe or you can stay 1.5m apart from other people.

- Clergy and readers who are socially distanced from others may remove their masks while speaking, and only when 1.5 metres from others.
- Parishioners may remove their masks if they are 1.5 metres apart from one another. (People living in the same household are not required to socially distance from each other.)
- 8. Singing is a high risk activity due to the transmission of droplets therefore:
- Choirs will be required to keep their masks on at all times during the liturgy.
- 10. A single cantor, who is significantly socially distanced at 7 metres or more from the congregation, may remove his or her mask while singing and then put it back on.
- 11. Outdoors: you must wear a mask when unable to stay 1.5m apart from people who are not part of your household.
