Feast of our Lady of Sorrows - Wednesday 15th September

The title, Our Lady of Sorrows, given to our Blessed Mother focuses on her intense suffering and grief during the passion and death of our Lord. Traditionally, this suffering was not limited to the passion and death event; rather, it comprised the seven dolors or seven sorrows of Mary.

- 1. At the prophecy of Simeon: "You yourself shall be pierced with a sword so that the thoughts of many hearts may be laid bare." (Luke 2:35).
- 2. At the flight into Egypt; "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt." (Mt 2:13).
- 3. Having lost the Holy Child at Jerusalem; "You see that your father and I have been searching for you in sorrow." (Luke 2:48).
- 4. Meeting Jesus on his way to Calvary;
- 5. Standing at the foot of the Cross; "Near the cross of Jesus there stood His mother." (John 19:25).
- 6. Jesus being taken from the Cross;
- 7. At the burial of Christ.

Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

On Tuesday, September 14th we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This day celebrates the cross as a sign of Christ's victory over sin and death for us. It is also called the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross. The cross is not a sign of defeat, but a sign of redemption. All are welcome to join in the celebration of the Holy Eucharist.
