# Twenty -Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time 16/17 October 2021

### Be joyful to serve at the altar, to be closer to Jesus!

Serving God as an Altar server is a wonderful way for a child to grow in faith as well as in responsibility, friendship, and other virtues. (The South Australian Catholic page- Facebook)

The boys and girls who serve at the Altar, are part of the liturgical team. At the Altar they join the priest together with other liturgical ministers, choir and the community in the celebration of Holy Eucharist. They serve at the Alter like angels, they are close to Jesus and Jesus loves it as he said "Let the little children come to me" (Mark 10:14).

Pope Francis acknowledged the important role of Altar servers while talking to the 9,000 youth in early August 2015, according to the National Catholic Reporter. The Pope told the young people that serving at the Altar, is a privileged way to draw closer to Jesus, which in turn "enables you to open yourselves to others, to journey together, to set demanding goals and to find the strength to achieve them." "It's helpful for young teens and tweens to become part of the Altar serving ministry because it's the most significant way to make a meaningful contribution to the liturgy," Dawson says. "It is a concrete way of participating in the community of

In addition to contributing their support to the liturgical celebration, Altar servers develop certain qualities through their service;

- Being an Altar server teaches children from a young age to love, revere and praise God.
- Serving at the Altar teaches children to be responsible and punctual. From an early age, they acquire good sense, and commitment to the Holy Mass. Servers are required to arrive early to each Mass in order to determine their roles, prepare items and dress in their albs. And also it helps them to be courageous and self-confident.
- Serving at the Altar instructs the children in the liturgy and the rich culture of the Church.
- Attentiveness; Altar servers learn the deeper meaning behind each step of the liturgy.
- Maturity; Altar serving contributes to a server's maturity as they learn lessons and put their knowledge into practice.

It's worth noting that all of us who have been Altar servers in our childhood treasure that period of our life with great pleasure and gratitude.

# Don't wait for the weekly roster:

Whenever your child/children come to Mass, and there are no Altar servers, you can assist to vest them and let them join the procession to the Altar. Anybody who has received First Holy Communion and has trained to be at the sanctuary are most welcome to Altar serve and there is no age limit. A certificate of voluntary service will be awarded to those who Altar serve ten times.

If your children become Altar servers, help them to feel proud of what they do, and pray for them. Help them to learn little by little to turn their actions into prayers and to grow in their faith journey.

# Financial Support- Tap and Go facilities are ready to use

Last Sunday I mentioned that following several requests from parishioners, we have decided to provide Tap and Go facilities in our church, to assist people who may wish to offer money and help the parish, but find that they don't have access to cash when they arrive at Church.

The donation point will be set at \$10, so each time you wave your credit card you will be making a donation of \$10 to the parish. We hope this will be a more

convenient way for some parishioners to donate to the parish, and that people will not feel uncomfortable if they do not contribute when the plate comes past at collection times. Also, small cards will be kept near the tap and go facilities. Feel free to take it and put in the plate when it comes around.

All in all, it is a safer, easier and more sensible way to donate as the carrying of cash is fast becoming a thing of the past. As of this weekend 16/17 October, this facility is ready to use. Any ideas and suggestions are most welcome.

To Tap and Go, just tap your credit card or bank card on the sensor and it will donate \$10 and once it has processed this first tap, (which may take 30 seconds), you can tap it again if you would like. A safe and handy way to give offering in this changing world.
