
Let our children learn the Lord's Prayer...

Why do we venerate at the Altar?

When we enter the Church we venerate the blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle. We make a low bow or a genuflection. The tabernacle is considered the holy of holies, Jesus Christ is present there in a true manner – soul and divinity, body and blood, although in the appearance of bread and wine.

At the same time, the priest and ministers make the proper reverence—that is, a low bow before the altar too.

The altar symbolizes the heart of the Church. It is the Lord's table and the centre of the Eucharistic action. It has always been considered a symbol of Christ. That is why we cover the altar with a cloth, out of reverence for the celebration of the memorial of the Lord's sacrifice. There also has to be a cross. adorned with the image of Christ crucified, either on the altar or near it, which calls to mind the saving Passion of the Lord.

Moreover, the altar of the New Covenant is the cross of the Lord (cf. Heb 13:10), from which the sacraments of the paschal mystery flow.

The altar signifies Christ Jesus, the living stone.
