Fourth Sunday of Advent 18/19 December 2021

Covid 19 Restrictions for Christmas; the occupancy limit at Clayfield is 300. Masks are mandatory at all Masses.

We have received updated Queensland Government directives in regards to occupancy limits in places of worship as of 17 December.

The new directive (Public Health and Social Measures linked to vaccination status) outlines the following occupancy limits for places of worship:

Whichever is greater:

1 person per 2 square metres indoors OR

100 % of seated venue capacity with ticketed and allocated seating up to a maximum of 200 people;

These limits apply to Mass, baptisms and other liturgies. There is no occupant density limit for outdoor Masses.

In addition to these occupancy limits, places of worship must continue to ensure attendees are registered via the Check-in Qld app.

There are some different arrangements in place for funerals and weddings.

Funerals conducted indoors may accommodate 100 % of seated venue capacity with ticketed and allocated seating up to a maximum of 500 people (even if this exceeds 1 person per 2 square metres).

There will be no occupancy limit for weddings, provided only fully vaccinated people attend. If anyone attending a wedding is unvaccinated, occupancy will be restricted to a maximum of 20 people.

Message from Parish administration

The 6pm Christmas Vigil Mass is currently over booked. We currently have 400 people that have booked in several weeks ago. The Queensland Government has just announced this week changes to the Covid rules which came into effective on Friday the 17th December. As a result the Church can only have up to 300 people to comply with the one person per 2 square metre rule. We are currently over booked by 100 people for the Christmas Vigil Mass.

Many of us have tried to workshop different options, however due to the late notice, our only realistic option is to ask that 100 people that are already booked in for the Vigil Mass to attend one of the other three Masses. There is ample space available at the Midnight, the 7am and the 9am Masses. This does not apply to those who are playing a role at the Vigil Mass, we have reserved seating in place for you and your families.

If you have received an email in regards to this change <u>please notify us via return email</u> <u>or by contacting the parish office by Monday</u> morning at the latest.

New appointment

Last weekend, the Archbishop published the announcement of my new appointment as the Parish Priest of Aspley.

As you know I belong to the religious order of the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate. It was the first indigenous religious congregation to exist in the Catholic Church of India and it now has more than 3000 members, serving different parts of the world.

From the very beginning the congregation had come under the Carmelite influence and it was affiliated with the Order of Discalced Carmelites. The religious life in the congregation was rooted in the Indian, Oriental and Carmelite spiritual traditions.

Being contemplatives in action, the members engaged in such activities as the Church in Kerala has needed at particular times. They preached retreats, administered the parishes, conducted seminaries for the training of the local clergy, met the challenge of educating the youth and disseminating Christian literature, laboured for the propagation of the faith and for the reunion of separated brethren, undertook works of mercy and started charitable institutions.

In Australia, our 23 priests are serving in different dioceses, and in Brisbane there are 8 priests serving in different parishes. And at Aspley we gather at different occasions, and those who are coming from different dioceses stay there.

On the first of January I will celebrate my first Holy Mass at Aspley, and at Clayfield celebrate my thanksgiving Mass on Sunday 26 December at 7am and 9am.

The copy of Archbishop's letter is given below:

TO THE PEOPLE OF GOD OF CLAYFIELD

Fr Biju Thomas CMI has been appointed as the Parish Priest of Our Lady and St Dympna, Aspley from 1 January, 2021. Aspley has been entrusted to the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate, which is Fr Biju's Congregation. The parish has been under the care of an Administrator since Fr Sunny Mathew CMI left the parish in early July.

Fr Neville Yun, Parish Priest of Our Lady Help of Christians parish, Hendra, will take on the additional appointment as the Administrator of St Agatha's, Clayfield, from 1 January 2022, and will be assisted by Fr Dan Ryan, the Vicar for Clergy, to provide mass supply for the parish in the New Year until other provisions can be made.

I am grateful for Fr Biju's ministry among you in these last two years and wish him well in his new role at Aspley.
