Hi all,

It's my first week technically back in the parish and it's been on like the clappers. It's great to see many of you again at Masses or around the office. As we start back into more uncertainty, it's important to remember that each of our lives is geared for life and ultimately the divine life. Our faith in Jesus provides the foundation for all we are and do. One key foundation about our faith is revisiting our Identity in Christ. Everyone of us has an experience of God, by how we were raised, maybe the moment/s of our conversion from adolescence to adulthood towards knowing God. When we reach adulthood, we still need to deepen this conversion towards God. Throughout scripture, we are reminded that we must understand God's identity. We are children of God and through baptism, we receive promises. We immediately have a spiritual dignity through sonship and daughtership with God. We also have the Holy Spirit dwelling in us, waiting patiently to partner with you in our daily lives. We have the authority of Jesus to use all the spiritual gifts: wisdom, knowledge, understanding, counsel, fortitude, piety and wonder and the ministerial gifts of the Spirit. These are listed a variety of ways in the Epistles. From Cor 12: We have Word of Wisdom, Word of Knowledge, Faith, Healings, Miracles, Prophecy Discernment of Spirits, Tongues and Interpretation of Tongues. All of these supernatural gifts are for service of the Church. The unfortunate thing is that the Church has not equipped its priests or its people to teach about and exercise these gifts readily.

We have a replacement priest up to Easter Sunday for both communities – **Fr Emmanuel Ayankudy**. So hopefully amongst Fr James O'Donoghue and the two of us we can get through this first quarter of the year. Please make him feel welcome.

Of course, the **Archbishop is presiding at St Agatha's this Saturday 5pm** so if you want to hear from the horse's mouth about his vision for the two communities you're welcome to attend. Bookings have already closed, but you can still come along and wait till all the booked people have been seated. There seems to be plenty of room still available at that Mass. FEAST OF ST AGATHA - OUR PARISH HEAVENLY PATRONESS

St. Agatha is a virgin-martyr of the early Church. From her very early years, the notably beautiful Agatha dedicated her life to God. She became a consecrated virgin, a state in life where young women choose to remain celibate and give themselves wholly to Jesus and the Church in a life of prayer and service.

She endured horrific suffering during her life and made many sacrifices for her faith. For all her suffering she is known as the patron saint of Sicily, bell founders, breast cancer patients, Palermo, rape victims and wet nurses. She is also considered to be a powerful intercessor when people suffer from fires.
