Third Sunday of Lent 20 March 2022

Hi everyone,

I have been in discussions with the coordinators of the Northside Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration group. So this weekend I was going to give an explanation of the practice and the spiritual nourishment of Perpetual Adoration. **Adoration or Eucharistic Adoration** is the simple practice of adoring Jesus, present in the Blessed Sacrament that is normally exposed in a monstrance The monstrance is a sacramental vessel that often resembles the sun. Here are some examples:









When Adoration begins, we bring out the Blessed Sacrament from the tabernacle and place the Eucharist in the monstrance. Adoration can last from 20 minutes to 24 hours or longer. When the duration is significantly longer we call this Perpetual Adoration. Usually when Adoration concludes, we repose the Blessed Sacrament back in the tabernacle. The priest or Deacon normally performs Benediction that ritualises this reposition. When Benediction doesn't take place, a lay person can repose Jesus back to the tabernacle. Adoration is also known as Holy Hour. St John Paul II reminded us that, "The spiritual lives of our families are strengthened through our Holy Hour". Here are some testimonies of the experience of adoration:

"Regular Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament over the past 12 years has radically transformed my life. Jesus has cared for me, spoken to me, and healed me. In Adoration, my heart rests".

"Adoration gives God a chance to hold me still and whisper in my ear".

"Adoration is an encounter with God. It is where I meet God and He meets me. For me, the main fruit of adoring Christ in the Blessed Sacrament is faith - faith in God and faith in His Church."

At all the masses on the 26^{th} /27th March and the $2/3^{rd}$ of April we will have speakers continuing to share their personal experiences of being adorers and how it has changed their life. We are hoping to start Perpetual Adoration at OLHC Church, Hendra after Easter Sunday.



REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

One major theme emerges from today's readings: incomprehensibility of God. We see it in the mysterious divine name, which distinguishes the God of Israel from all others and yet leaves us in the dark as to its meaning. We see it as God communicates with us through inanimate objects and the people in our lives. Finally, we see that God both pardons iniquities and decides to root out unfruitful branches, and we are confused by such inconsistency.

In the midst of this ambiguity we have one sure source of stability – Christ. It is Christ who reveals the nature and meaning of the divine name; it is Christ who intercedes for us before God. Christ, the one who set his face toward Jerusalem, there to suffer and die, is the great messenger through whom God is revealed. He is the one who reveals majesty through the simplicity of a bush; he is the one who judges with the patience of a gardener. However, the limits of the experience and mercy of God in our lives are defined by our own openness. Despite the blessings that we receive in the wildernesses of our lives, it could happen that God is not pleased with us. We must not take God's goodness for granted.

These readings close on a note of caution. Take care! We might be able to rest secure in the knowledge of the love and mercy of God, but these readings tell us that we should not dare to rest passively or complacently.
