Easter Sunday (Year A) 9 April 2023

Hi all,

As we approach Easter, let's take the time to reflect about Jesus' journey to the Cross.





As we enter the Paschal Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday) let's become acutely present to Jesus' passion and death. On Holy Thursday, we will ponder the Gift of the Most Holy Eucharist. On Good Friday, we will hear Jesus' passion proclaimed from the Gospel of John. Thus, this week begins with the proclamation of the Passion and ends with the Passion as a way of drawing us more deeply into the mystery of Christ's saving Sacrifice.

At the heart of the story of the Passion of Jesus is the manifestation of a love like no other. The love we witness this week is a love that is so pure, so selfless, so sacrificial and so transforming that it is beyond comprehension. The love that we witness is one in which God permits Himself to enter the deepest humiliation ever seen. He does this so that He can meet us in our lowliness, sin, and fallenness, and raise us up to the highest heights imaginable.

I pray everyone has a holy, peace-filled and safe Easter. Many people at that first Easter were full of fear, anxiety and uncertainty. The Jesus we believe in is the Jesus who suffered, died and rose again. Through our baptism we become incarnational people. We become part of Jesus' journey to the cross, to the tomb, back to life and into everlasting life!! Lord help us to embrace the cycle of life through faith in your Son: suffering, death and resurrection.

Blessings and may the Crucified and Risen Christ help us onto a new road of possibilities!!

It is also used to maintain over 70 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus. Whilst life in the Holy Land is returning to some new sense of normality (as is the rest of the world) the Church and people of the Holy Land are still struggling with reduced income due to fewer pilgrims and lower church attendance around the world.

# Mother of Mercy Parish Saturday Adoration

#### Mother of Mercy Parish *Prayer Engine* of the Parish

The Prayer Engine will meet at OLHC Church, Hendra every Tuesday, from 1:00-2:30pm. All are welcome to join in prayer!

In this portion of John's narrative, we find Mary Magdalene going alone in the dark, returning to the tomb where Jesus had been buried. Grief-stricken and distraught, she needs to be close to her beloved Jesus. She arrives and sees the stone rolled back. So even more distraught, she runs in the dark back to tell his disciples.

Have you ever tried to run in the dark? Stumbling, unsure, the whole range of twisted emotions. In so many ways in our world today, we are impelled to run in the dark as we confront concerns about care of Mother Earth, our countries, our congregations, our families, our friends, ourselves, how to go, or at least from familiar past? What is inside the dark space of our anxieties?

The Gospel tells us how Peter and John ran and looked inside, having to find tangible proof of their tortured and dead brother. And then they went home, but Mary stayed and wept. Today's segment of the Gospel stops here with Mary, staying and being simply present.

The reading from Colossians reminds us that we have "died and now are hidden in Christ." Hidden in Christ — what a profound way to describe simply being present. But we know that death, move that changes, or other events in life that we experience as "dying" are not the end of the story. We know with rock solid certainty, as the sequence reminds us, what Mary proclaimed, saw and experienced: "Jesus my hope has risen." It's what we say this Easter day of 2023 in our current realities, as we are called to live out that rock solid truth that "Jesus my hope is risen." It's what we say *—Sister Rachel Callahan. CSC*
