Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time 28 January 2024 (YEAR B)

For some time now the church has been engaged in an ongoing conversation about the idea of celibacy, particularly as it relates to the priesthood. I don't wish to address that conversation directly; it will inevitably continue. What I do want to reflect upon however, is something that seems to get missed in this conversation, namely that celibacy, if it is lived authentically, is not something imposed but rather a gift which is discerned.



St Paul, in this weekend's second reading, speaks about celibacy. It is not priestly celibacy that he is speaking about - but celibacy in general. He recommends it to all the church but does not impose it on anyone. St Paul is not against marriage, but he sees in celibacy a higher gift. He invites all those who discern the gift, to follow the Lord with singleness of heart and so dedicate themselves to love of God and his Church, free from the necessary worries and distractions that come with family life.

A core part of my own journey towards the priesthood was the discernment of a call to celibacy. I found within me a powerful desire to dedicate myself to the work of the Gospel and to follow Christ in a life that closely imitated his own. I have lived that call imperfectly- yet it has defined my life and continues to bring me joy and consolation. Only having first discerned the gift of celibacy did I step forward to accept the priesthood. If the Church were to change its teaching on the topic of priestly celibacy, I still would not regret my commitment to it. Celibacy has been a gift in my life, one that has allowed me to live my own life more fully as a gift to others. Please pray for me as I continue to live a celibate life. Like all vocations, it has both joys and struggles.



Reflection by Nick Brodie

According to Pope Francis, 'Jesus did not mince words'. Any way you look at it, Christ's proclamation was a turning point in history with phenomenal ramifications. The moment has arrived! The Kingdom of God is close! There is Good News to be heard!

This was Jesus' message about himself. 'He was the salvation,' the Pope notes, who entered human history in a powerfully new way.

When we look at this Gospel, Jesus also had another component of his message: the way of discipleship. Its elements are straightforward: repent, believe, follow.

As the Pope elaborates, Jesus 'invites us to recognise ourselves as in need of God and his grace; to have a balanced attitude with regard to earthly goods; to be welcoming and humble toward everyone; to know and fulfil ourselves in the encounter with and service of others.' This is how we can change our lives to follow more closely the one in whom we believe.

And, as the Pope further suggests, each phase of our life 'has its own value, and can be a privileged moment of encounter with the Lord.' Therefore, we should be open to welcoming Jesus again and again in new places and situations. Whether in our parishes, homes or workplaces, our lives are full of encounters that can change us and those we meet. This is the way.
