Fifth Sunday of Easter 28 April 2024 (YEAR B)

"Talk is cheap", so the saying goes. Similarly, another proverb proclaims that "actions speak louder than words". This sentiment is at the heart of this weekend's second reading from St John. Our love, according to St John, must be no mere pretence but rather "something real and active". Love, in the Christian sense, is not simply a pleasant feeling engendered by a cherished relationship, but rather it implies an activity.



If we contemplate the love of God for us, we see that God's love is not merely a sentiment or good wish. Rather, in Christ, God has acted decisively. During this Easter season we celebrate the triumph of God's Love, made incarnate in the person of Jesus. God has loved us so much that He sent His only begotten Son to suffer and to die upon the cross. "No one has greater love than this" Jesus says to his disciples "than to lay down one's life for one's friends" (Jn 15:13). Love, in the Christian sense, is the total commitment to the good of the other, even at great cost to ourselves.

In the Resurrection of Jesus, love has conquered, even when assailed by all the forces of hatred and violence. To love is not easy, it implies a kind of crucifixion and resurrection. This is true in a literal sense when we contemplate the love of Christ, but it belongs to us to imitate Him. To love like Jesus, one must lay down their lives for their friends. It is death to self-centredness and ego. If, however, we can follow the example of Jesus, there arises in us the 'new life' promised by Christ. Indeed, the one who truly loves, St John assures us, has the spirit of the living God within them.

Reflection by Dianne Bergant CSA

Today we reflect on the way salvation brings an ecclesial community into being. This community is joined to Jesus as branches are part of the vine. It is a multi-faceted community, devoted to good works and to prayer.

The image of the vine and the branches is an intimate characterisation of the community of believers who share the same divine life. This community thrives on Christ's resurrected life that surges through all of its members. The early church was a multi-ethnic community. It included inhabitants from Jerusalem, Judea, Galilee, Samaria and even Damascus. Some of these people were firmly rooted in Jewish customs, others were more Greek in their culture. It was the fulfilment of the promises made so often in the past, that the saving power of God would reach the whole world.

Our own ecclesial community of believers is also multiethnic. Where formerly parishes or liturgical assemblies might be made up of people of only one ethnic identity or economic status, today there is much greater diversity and rapid change of character. Like the early Christians, we too are often suspicious of newcomers. In the face of all of this variety, we are called to open our hearts to the various manifestations of God's power and to fashion a community that gives glory to God. Today's readings remind us that we demonstrate our love for God and for each other in the way we live. Joined to Christ as branches are part of the vine, we too are enlivened and thereby bear fruit in abundance.
